### LEWIS BOULEVARD IS PUBLIC STREET

Exhibition Association Has No Power to Fence It, Says Frink.

The City Council yesterday received a request for a lease of a lot of land on the West Side adjoining No. 14 berth to the Federal Government as it was desired to build a potato warehouse there; a complaint from the electrical section of the Retail Merchants' Association that the electrical by-laws were being violated by the employees of the Civic Power Commission, and an intimation that the survey of the city would not be completed for about two years yet.

The report of the committee of the whole, referring to timber for sewers, hydro matters and taking of rock from Hurd Island, as published yesterday, was adopted.

Mayor Fisher reported that he had been notified by C. G. Murdoch that it would probably be two years yet before the city survey was completed,



It is reported that nearly 700 customers were being served and the commission would be ready to take over the street lighting, south of Union street, on Nov. 1. On motion of Commissioner Thornton the report was received and filed and the common clerk instructed to write the commission for a report on the amount of revenue received.

Tenders for copper wire were received and referred to the civic power commission from the following firms: Northern Electric Co., Canadian General Electric Co., Standard Underground Cable Co., H. M. Hopper, Canada Wire and Cable Co., and G. E. Phillips.

Commissioner Frink reported that he found the Lewis Boulevard was a street and that the Exhibition Association had no right to fence off the south end of Wentworth street.

He recommended that the Association be notified to remove the fence with the understanding that they would be allowed to put it up two weeks before an exhibition and keep it up two weeks after the fair closed. This carried unanimously.

Mayor Frink reported that the expenses in connection with the opening of the dry dock would be about \$5,000 and His Worship was given authority to expend the necessary amount.

Commissioner Bullock presented a request from A. Gray, resident engineer of the Federal Public Works Department, for a lease from the city of a lot of land adjoining berth No. 14, West Side, as the Government wished to erect a potato shed on it. This was referred to the commissioner and city solicitor for a report.
