C. N. R. RAIL ORDER PLACING THIS WEEK

A continuance of active operations in the rail mills at Sault Ste. Marie and Sydney is likely as a result of the splitting of a 40,000-ton order between these two producers by the Canadian National Railways. Negotiations have been proceeding for some time and, according to semi-official information, the business is semi-official information, the business is likely to be placed within the next couple of days. It is noteworthy that the United States Steel Corporation and leading independent producers lowered their price on steel rails to \$40, Pittsburg basis, within the past ten days. This is a reduction of \$7 per ton. It is anticipated that 20,000 tons will be placed with each of the two companies.
