**NEWLY CREATED BARONET  
WELL KNOWN IN CANADA**

The name of Douglas Alexander as a baronet of the United Kingdom appears in the Official Gazette of June 4 in the list of birthday honors conferred by King George.

Sir Douglas Alexander, Bart., is the president of the Singer Manufacturing Company and its sewing machinery subsidiary corporations all over the world. The honor is conferred upon him in recognition of notable war services rendered both by the Singer Companies, of which he is the head, and by himself personally.

The career of Douglas Alexander has

been a most interesting one. He was born July 4, 1864, at Halifax, Yorkshire, England, son of Andrew Alexander, well-known Canadian horticulturist and botanist. At an early age his parents went to Canada and settled in the city of Hamilton, Province of Ontario, where Douglas Alexander was educated at the Collegiate Institute until he was admitted to the Law Society of Upper Canada. He was articled to Alexander Bruce, K. C., called to the bar and admitted as a solicitor in chancery in 1886. After a short practice in Hamilton, he entered the service of the Singer Manufacturing Company, became a director of the company in 1896, was appointed vice-president in 1905, succeeding the

late Commodore Bourne with whom he had been associated as the vice-president during a number of years.

Sir Douglas Alexander resides at Edgehill Farm, Stamford, Conn., and at No. 1 West 72nd street, New York City. The necessity for prolonged travel to the company's foreign branches has not left him much leisure, but he is keenly interested in all sports. He was married in 1892 to Helen H. Gillespie of Hamilton, Ontario, and has four children, Douglas H. of Princeton University, Agnes E., Helen D., and Archibald G. Alexander.

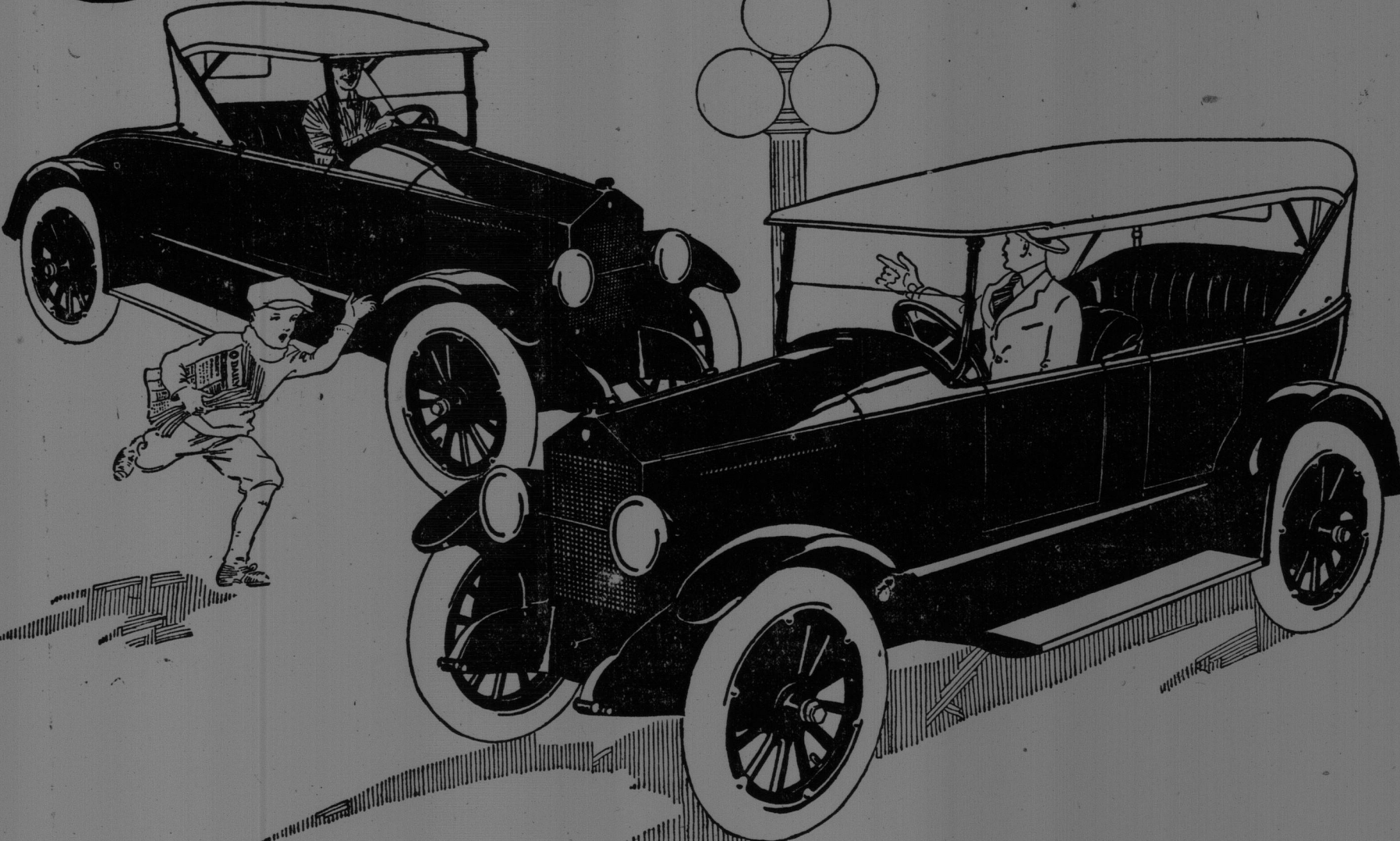
