LEONARD AND DUNDIE.

Jersey City, Feb. 9.—Benny Leonard, light heavyweight boxing champion, fought Johnny Dundee, of New York, every round of an eight round bout tonight. Dundee put up a stiff fight but the champion out-punched him throughout. Leonard weighed 184 pounds and Dundee 181 1/2. Leonard staggered his opponent a half ten times during the contest. Dundee came back with renewed vigor each time he resumed his fighting tactics. As in his previous bouts with the champion, Dundee used his rushing "liger cut" and gave a spectacular exhibition. Leonard had no difficulty in picking openings to place hard and effective punches. In the opening round, Leonard scored a hook to the head that sent Dundee reeling to the ropes. He was back immediately. For the remainder of the bout Leonard centered his attack on the body, administering an especially severe drubbing in the fifth, sixth and seventh rounds. In the last session Dundee was fighting almost as hard as in the first. The final bell his body showed the effects of the champion's blows, while there was no mark on his head.

Soldier Bouts in Toronto.
