
Fifty Boy Scouts who have been camping at Chipman, returned home yesterday after a most delightful outing. H. O. Eaman, scoutmaster, was in charge.

**NO AGREEMENT ON VALLEY RAILWAY MATTER.**  
Hon. W. P. Jones returned yesterday from Toronto where he had gone to take part in the negotiations for running rights for the Valley railway over the C. P. R. between St. John and Westfield.
