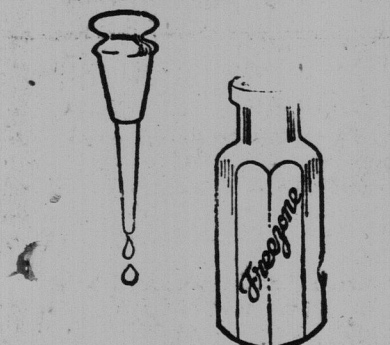

### MILITARY HEADS GATHER AT PARIS

Basel, Oct. 25.—(By the Associated  
Press).—The German war cabinet  
considered President Wilson's reply  
at a long session yesterday, accord-  
ing to the Frankfort Zeitung.

It was decided not to answer at  
the present time, but to wait until  
it is learned what the Entente armis-  
tice conditions may be.

Washington, Oct. 25.—Arrival in  
France of Colonel House, President Wil-  
son's personal representative, and Ad-  
miral Benson, the highest ranking officer  
in the American navy has cleared the  
way for the beginning of such delibera-  
tions by the supreme war council at  
Versailles as may be necessary to frame  
the draft of an armistice to be submit-  
ted to Germany. The premiers of the  
Allied countries, who make up the polit-  
ical elements of the council, can be  
assembled at short notice, but it is pre-  
sumed that their presence will not be  
necessary until the military and naval  
members have completed their work.

It was said today in official quarters  
that Colonel House would not be a mem-  
ber of the council, at least for the pres-  
ent; that he simply is the eyes and ears  
of the president in Europe charged with  
ascertaining the exact state of public  
and private feeling in regard to all mat-  
ters connected with the war. Possessed  
of full knowledge of this nature, it is  
believed that he will be president to deal  
with every complex problem that will  
arise as soon as negotiations for an  
armistice and peace are fully under way.

### LOCAL BOARD OF TRADE DISAPPROVES OF WESTERN JAUNT

Proposition From Quebec is  
Considered Ill-Timed—The  
Committee to Consider the  
Charges on Business Prof-  
its Tax.

Having received special permission  
from the board of health the council  
of the board of trade met yesterday in  
regular session. This is the first time  
in the history of the board that per-  
mission to hold a meeting has had to  
be secured from the board of health.

A communication was received from  
the Quebec board of trade respecting  
the proposition of T. M. Keirstead of  
Three Rivers, and Toronto, for the  
building of thirty wooden steamers of  
3,000 tons each for the handling of Cana-  
dian grain through Canadian ports  
rather than allowing it to go through  
American ports. The Quebec board  
suggested that twenty-five delegates  
each from Quebec, Halifax and St. John  
boards of trade make a tour of west-  
ern Canada and during this tour inter-  
est in the grain growers and exporters in  
routing their grain through Canadian  
Atlantic ports.

The Quebec board had prepared an  
itinerary. The local board council  
thought that the time was inopportune  
to take the proposed trip, more particu-  
larly as the federal government had al-  
ready outlined and decided upon its ship-  
building policy.

A communication from the maritime  
branch of the Canadian Manufacturers'  
Association was received which dealt  
with the proposed maritime conference  
on December 11, and the local board was  
requested to send a delegation to this  
conference, which is to be held at Am-  
herst. No action was taken in the mat-  
ter pending further information. A  
resolution from the same body respecting  
the fire waste in this country was re-  
ceived. This matter was referred to the  
special committee of the board dealing  
with fire insurance.

A letter from Captain A. V. Sefert-  
ovich, royal consul for Serbian relief, was  
received, asking that a Serbian relief  
committee be formed in this city. The  
communication was referred to Mayor  
Hayes for treatment.

The Winnipeg board of trade wrote,  
forwarding a resolution which called for  
certain changes in the composition of  
the Canada Food Board. The resolu-  
tion stated that in the opinion of the  
Winnipeg board each province of the  
dominion should be represented by a  
member of the Canada Food Board, and  
that there should be three members from

### Germany's Food Outlook.

Germany and her allies face another  
serious food shortage. Roumania and  
the Ukraine, which were counted on to  
supply a large part of the Central Pow-  
ers' needs, will themselves have a short-  
age and will have nothing to export.  
A drought is responsible. Roumania  
provided the Central Powers with 8-  
9,000,000 tons of grain last year, but this  
year it really needs imports to fill its  
own needs. The Ukrainian supply is dis-  
appointing to the Germans, and may  
be regarded as negligible. The German  
crop is of average dimensions. Hun-  
gary's is the same, but Austria has a crop  
failure. Hence the Central Powers face  
a hard winter in respect to food condi-  
tions.

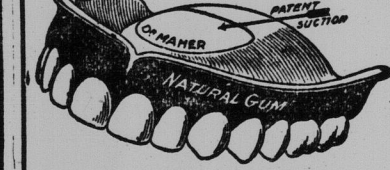
