FANCY COAT SUIT.

The cost of making the dress is as follows:
 2 yards 44-inch material, 2 yard..... \$2.00
 1 yard 2 1/2-inch satin for girdle and revers..... .50
 2 yards 1 1/2-inch all-over lace for waist..... .50
 2 yards 4-inch lace for trimming at 20c yard..... .40



Study the pattern carefully and be sure that the measurements are correct for this waist is a little more difficult than the average model. Now fold the material and along the fold place the back (B) and collar (C). The pleated bodice may be arranged on a lengthwise thread of the goods, as may also the sleeve collar and outer front. The girdle should be placed on a bias fold of the material.

Make and fit the lining; then begin the outside of the waist. First, pleat the front, creating an slot perforation; bring folds to corresponding small "o" perforations and tack. Tuck back, creating an slot perforation; stitch 1/4 inch from fold. Close underarm seam as notched, close shoulder seam. Gather lower edge between double collar perforations and 2 inches above. Sew large collar to neck edge, center-backs and notches even. Arrange an lining, centering even; stitch lower edges together, bringing underarm seam to large "o" perforation in lining. Close front seam of narrow peplum; large "o" perforations indicate front; sew to waist, center even. Pleat girdle and peplum, creating an slot perforation, bring folds to corresponding lines of small "o" perforations and press. Single small "o" perforation indicates upper edge of girdle. Adjust peplum, bringing single large and double small "o" perforations in peplum and in girdle together. Adjust girdle, center-backs and lower edges even.

Adjust strap to position on sleeve, corresponding small "o" perforations even. Close seams as notched, easing fullness between double "o" perforations. Sew in armholes, inside seam at notch in front. The changeable silks with figures in bright colors are splendid for a dress of this design.

A very dressy model developed in changeable silk with a dainty figure. It is trimmed with a girdle and revers of satin. Lace also enhances the beauty of the decorative effect.

Figured silks are used for fancy coat suits this season, and the model shown here will be sure to find great favor among well-dressed women. The skirt is slightly draped at the front and finished with a rather deep hem.

The coat is built upon a fitted lining and has long two-seam sleeves and either high or low collar. It may be made with or without a pleated peplum.

MARINE NOTES.
 New Zealand liner Southern left Sydney yesterday morning at 7.30 bound for St. John, but was forced to put back at drift ice was packed in the steamer lane for miles out to sea. The Southern will make another attempt to leave the ice-locked harbor at the first opportunity. The New Zealand liner will load a record cargo here, consisting of more than 400 automobiles, besides a heavy shipment of package freight and lumber. Furness liner Rapidian is due to leave Halifax tonight for St. John.
 The schooner St. Bernard grounded on the bar at the eastern end of Parkridge Island while getting under way yesterday morning bound for Salsin with lumber. The tug Nereid went to the assistance of the stranded vessel and towed her off the shoals. No damage was done and the St. Bernard proceeded.

Two large hoisting scows which were used here by Contractor Charleston, will be towed to Gaspe this week by the Reliable.
 Montreal, April 29—Capt. Kendall, R. N. R., will succeed Captain James A. Murray, appointed harbor master at Quebec, as commander of the Empress of Ireland.
 The Allan Liner Virginia sailed yesterday being the last mail boat from St. John this season. Among the passengers were Mrs. William Vassie and W. W. Corfield of this city. There were twenty-one saloon passengers, forty-one second and 223 third class besides a full cargo of freight.
