HERRING SUPPLY AT EASTPORT IS GOOD

Eastport, Me., Aug. 16-Never before in the history of the herring business in Eastport have the little fishes been so plentiful as at the present time, thousands of hogheads having been received at the factories here and in Lunenburg during the last week and all indications point to an unlimited supply. On Saturday so many fish were received that many hogheads were taken to the fertilizer plant, the factories not being able to properly take care of them over Sunday.

CAMPBELLTON BOOM IN BUILDING CONTINUES

(Campbellton Graphic) The building inspector's report for July shows that the building boom is still holding out, and that we can congratulate ourselves that there is no danger of Campbellton dropping back. We are going forward and our rate of progress is being well maintained. During July thirty-three building permits were issued, the total value being \$122,000. Of these buildings twenty-six are wood and seven either brick or concrete.

ST. JOHN GIRL AT HOME ON DECK OF FATHER'S SCHOONER

Miss Hazel Phipps of Main Street is Quoted By Baltimore Newspaper on Joys of Life at Sea

It will be of interest to friends in St. John to know that Miss Hazel Phipps, of Main street, North End, is in Baltimore, Md., with her father, James W. Phipps, captain of the schooner "Rothesay." While in that city recently she chatted entertainingly to a newspaper man about her experiences on the seas, saying she was perfectly at home on her father's vessel, and "just loved to promenade on the deck during a storm. Girls who stay home do not know what they are missing," said Miss Phipps. "I clothe myself in a long sea coat, and a big nor'wester cap, and don't mind the weather a bit. I relieve father on the quarter-deck, and it is just simply great to be in command of the big ship. I feel like a full-fledged captain when I shout orders through the megaphone to the men. I can sail her free in a running breeze or reef her down in a squall. On our last visit to St. Thomas I was invited to a banquet aboard a Danish training ship and had several dances with a Danish prince. It was one of the most enjoyable evenings of my life."

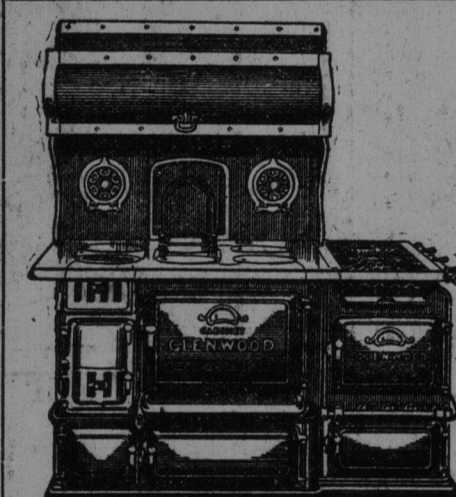
