

WITNESS EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER (Cont'd):

Q- How far away do you think you could hear this loud speaking?
A- I wouldn't know.

Q- You heard it?
A- I heard it.

Q- Although you couldn't hear what was said?

A- I wasn't paying any attention to what they were talking about.

Q- So there was nothing unusual that would draw your attention to what was being said, other than the fact they were standing talking together and Lamonte was being held by DiPaolo?

A- No, sir.

Q- Was he shaking him?

A- No, sir.

BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER: That is all, sir.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR:

Q- You said you were three feet away from where the accused and Lamonte were standing?

A- Yes, sir.

Q- What was your position in relation to them? Where were you standing?

A- I was standing right by my bed.

Q- You were standing three feet back from the end of the bed?

A- I was right about the centre of my own bed.

Q- And the accused and Lamonte were down at the end of the bed, in the aisle, arguing?

A- No, they were right between the beds, just about here, in the corner.

Q- You were in the same aisleway between the two beds?

A- Yes.

Q- Were you facing them?

A- Yes.
