## THE MARKET

The market prices for to-morrow are likely to be about the same as for the last month with the exception of fresh eggs which are fluctuating a great deal in price. Eggs are quoted as ranging from 25 to 35 cents per dozen but have sold as high as 50 cents. Prices are ranging about as follows: Round Beef 19 to 16c; Corn Beef 14 to 15c; Corn Beef 14 to 15c; Salt Pork 12 to 14c; Lamb (fore-quarter) 19 to 12c; Lamb (hind-quarter) 14 to 16c; Chickens per pair 50 to 90c; Duck per pair \$1.15 to \$1.25; Geese per pair \$1.20 to \$1.30; Turkey per lb. 23 to 25c; Carrots 25 to 30c per peck; Turnips 15 to 20c per peck; Beets 25 to 35c per peck; Parsnips 35 to 40c; Potatoes 20 to 25c; Onions 5c a lb. 7 lbs. for 25c.
