

## WARLIKE PEOPLE MUST BE FORCED TO FEAR BATTLE

President Wilson Maintains  
League is Essential for Best  
Interests of the World.

### WARNS AGAINST FAKE AMERICANISM

Germany Not the Only Nation  
That Aspires to Rule the  
World, He Says.

Washington, Oct. 28.—President Wilson received at the White House today a delegation of pro-league Republicans. His address to the delegation was the first he has made since he was taken ill more than a year ago. President Wilson appealed for the completion of the "great moral achievement" which, he said, the great war represented, asserting that "it will have been fought in vain" unless the United States completes the work she then began.

"There is only one way to secure the world peace," he declared, "and that is by making it so dangerous to break the peace that no other nation will have the audacity to attempt it."

Warns America.

The President declared that the "so-called Americanism" practiced so much about in the United States is "spurious and invented for party purposes only."

The President warned his hearers not to be deceived into supposing that imperialism, schemed and with the defeat of Germany or "that Germany is the only nation that entered such schemes or was moved by sinister ambitions and long standing jealousies to attack the very structure of civilization. There are other nations," said the President, "which are already moved by commercial jealousies, by the desire to dominate and to have their own way in politics and in enterprise, and it is necessary to check them and to apprise them that the world will be united against them as it was against Germany if they attempt any similar thing."

Touched by Appearance

Members of the delegation in a formal statement after leaving the White House said they were "deeply touched" by the physical appearance of Mr. Wilson, who plainly showed the effects of long illness and the tremendous strain he has been carrying.

The President was described as being greatly moved as he read from a manuscript his reply to the address of the delegation, and especially so when he referred to the United States soldiers and the mothers of those who had fallen in battle.

"It was evident that he was voicing the profoundest emotions of his heart," said the statement, adding that "the whole occasion was impressively solemn and tender. The delegation said they felt that they might be Mr. Wilson's final appeal to the conscience of his countrymen in the supreme moral decision they are called upon to make."

Article Ten

President Wilson opened his address to the delegation with the declaration that the editors and publishers of the United States "would render a great service" if they would publish the full text of the covenant of the League of Nations.

"Having read the text," he said, "you will be able to judge for yourselves a great many things in which you are now in danger of being misled."

Of article ten, Mr. Wilson said that it was "the specific pledge of the members of the League that they will unite to resist exactly the things which Germany attempted no matter what she attempts in the future."

"Article X," he declared, "is the specific redemption of the pledge which the free governments of the world gave to their people when they entered the war. They promised their people not only that Germany would be prevented from carrying out its plan but that the world would be safeguarded in the future from similar designs."

## JAPAN A SOURCE OF FEAR TO DUTCH

Holland Believes "Yellow  
Race" Seeks Foothold in Her  
East Indian Possessions.

Amsterdam, Oct. 28.—There was much talk in Holland about ten years ago regarding the "yellow peril," though little was written on the subject in its relation to the Dutch colonies.

It is well known that the Dutch East Indies, especially the island of Java, form the chief source of wealth for Holland, as they have done for many centuries. Sugar, tobacco, coffee, tea, oil, rubber and tin are produced here in abundance, and Dutch trade and shipping are directed principally to these distant sources of wealth. The colonial Dutch population number about 50,000 and it speaks well for Dutch rule that the population of Java alone greatly exceeds that of the mother-country, while the exploitation of the colonies could be continued without any resistance from the natives with whom the government works in perfect accord.

The "swelling" of the natives by the Dutch planters, which was an unpleasant feature about a century ago, has passed away, and since the middle of the nineteenth century the Dutch government has studied the interests of the native population, placing their rule on a fair and just basis. Centralization of Dutch colonial administration in Dutch hands at the Hague was found to be necessary in the early years, but since then power has been delegated to its representatives under a governor general at Batavia.

The very success of Dutch rule has given rise to fears of what came to be known as the "yellow peril"—in other words, Japan. It might be interesting to trace the origin of this danger. There are a good many Japanese living in the Dutch East Indies who are connected principally with the Japanese trade with the islands. Important shipping relations developed between the Japanese and Dutch East India archipelagoes.

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## EX-KAISER HAS EYE ON THRONE OF GERMANY YET

Using Force in Upper Silesia  
as Means to Regain Empire

Berlin, Oct. 28.—Proof that the ex-Kaiser is making a serious attempt to be restored to the throne of Germany is multiplying in various parts of the republic and the effect of lavish expenditures of money or supporters of the Hohenzollern family are becoming apparent, and many leaders of the movement are outwardly showing their true color. In Upper Silesia a strong military organization under Captain Von Roder has adopted the imperialist coat of arms with two crossed swords and a motto meaning, "For Kaiser, Freedom, and Country."

The organization was formed several months ago and has its own information service, post office and wireless system. Von Roder has 13,000 troops and 72 guns in command of Colonel Bausner, formerly Ludendorff's chief of staff at brigade headquarters.
