DAVID RUSSELL TELLS OF PLOT

Testifies in Suit for Conspiracy

Attacked in Streets of Montreal on Two Occasions

Woman Afterwards Tried to Lure Him Into Compromising Positions—Dr. Roddick to Be Examined in Atlantic City About Certificate of Lunacy.

Montreal, Sept. 25—A large array of legal talent was present in the case of David Russell vs. the Pinkerton Detective Agency and Manager McNamara, of the Montreal office, when the examination of discovery and the preparation of the interrogatories for the examination of Dr. T. G. Roddick, in Atlantic City, was held at the Ontario House today.

The plaintiff, Mr. Russell, is represented by Donald MacMaster, K. C., J. Claud Hickson, K. C., and G. Campbell with T. Cass Casgrain, K. C., as counsel, whilst the interests of the defendant are being looked after by Kenneth R. MacPherson and W. J. Shaughnessy, with Aime Geofrin, K. C., as counsel.

The main object of the session was taken up with the filing of exhibits which will figure in the case. The action, which was entered last March, is for \$200,000, this being claimed for alleged conspiracy on the part of the defendants to cause plaintiff to be incarcerated in an institution for the insane.

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FRENCH BATTLESHIP BLOWS UP; 400 DEAD

Terrible Disaster in Toulon Harbor Caused Great Havoc

Powder Magazines of Warship Liberte Exploded and Other Craft Near By Are Badly Damaged—Big Craft Sank in a Few Minutes—Concussion Shattered All the Glass in the City.

Canadian Press. Toulon, France, Sept. 25—The battleship Liberte was torn apart and totally destroyed by an explosion of her magazines today. Nearly 400 of her crew were killed. The battleship Republic was badly damaged and the battleships Demosic and Verite also suffered severely from the masses of twisted iron and armor plate that were hurled upon their decks.

This is the greatest disaster that has ever fallen upon the French navy and in magnitude is almost without precedent in the annals of the world's fighting ships. The grief which prostrates the fleet and nation is made more intense by the memory of the recent review here, a notable display of France's naval greatness at which the doomed ship was one of the finest figures.

The explosion which wiped out one of France's newest and most powerful battle ships occurred at 5.53 o'clock this morning. It was preceded by a series of smaller explosions which were the result of an outbreak of fire. The flames spread rapidly in spite of all efforts to master them and reach the magazines before there was time to flood them.

The magazines exploded with tremendous violence, sending death and destruction in every direction. A number of men have already been extricated alive from the fantastically torn and twisted mass of wreckage which was once the Liberte and the hope is strong that there are others within the broken hull who can be reached.

A Desperate Battle. Exactly from what cause or when the fire broke out has not been established, but it is believed that it had smoldered for several hours. Of the vessel's full complement of 1,000 men, only 100 are reported to have survived. The rest were either killed or injured. The fire was first discovered at 4 a. m. and the bugles immediately sounded the alarm. The crew rushed to quarters and fought desperately the spreading flames, but it was soon evident that the fire had obtained a firm hold.

The Exilda, which is bound from New York for Eatonville (N. S.), arrived here today, reporting having been run into off Little Gull during the fog at 1 o'clock this morning by an unknown steam yacht. Her job stayed was cut away and her cut-water damaged somewhat.

CARVELL WON IN CARLETON COUNTY

Earlier Returns Are Confirmed

DEAD MAY REACH 400. Late tonight the naval authorities declared that the number of victims is greater than was supposed. The official estimate is now given as between 300 and 400 dead or missing. The work done was quickly begun. Under the shattered steel the first body recovered was that of an officer which was buried from under an evening with a box of books.
