CONGREGATIONAL CHANGES.

PRESBYTERY OF HAMILTON.

The congregation of Crowland was separated from that of Welland on the twenty-first day of July, 1885.

PRESBYTERY OF SARNIA.

The congregation of Knox Church, Petrolia, was united with that of the first Presbyterian Church, Petrolia, on the first day of October, 1885.
