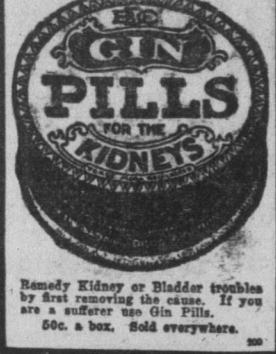

Modern Flax Mill Planned by Gov't

DEMONSTRATION PLANT PROPOSED FOR WESTERN ONTARIO

Ottawa March 17.—The war materials board of Great Britain has confirmed by cable its intention of diverting the use of Western Canada flax-growers the 10,000 bushels of seed now held at St. John N.B. The flax seed was in the first place commandeered by the Canadian Government on behalf of the British board and the first intention was to ship it to growers overseas. The seed was grown in Western Ontario.

Flax growers in Ontario viewing with alarm possible injury to the reputation of their seed now firmly established on British home markets have strongly protested.

Leaves for England.

R.J. Hutchinson chief of the fiber department of the Dominion Experimental Farm, left yesterday for England and will discuss this arrangement with the authorities there and will also take charge of the sale of a car of Ontario flax fiber, made up from different mills here, to determine its value sold on the open market in England against fiber produced in Europe. Much depends on this effort to fit and establish a permanent market for Ontario's surplus fiber.

Mr. Hutchinson while in Ireland, especially will study improved methods of tank retting, scutching and other treatments of flax in the production of fiber as well as improved machinery used.

It is understood that the Government has in view the erection of a modern flax mill in Western Ontario, where all the newest appliances will be installed to demonstrate the production of fiber under most modern and up-to-date conditions.
