

Page 27, line 4.—Leave out “that Officer” and insert “the said Department on payment of a fee of three dollars therefor.”

Page 31, line 3.—After “required” insert “for which he is hereby allowed the sum of one dollar for each copy, if the number of words therein do not exceed four hundred, but if the number of words therein exceed four hundred, he is allowed ten cents additional for every hundred words over and above four hundred words.”

*Clause C.*

“There shall be allowed to every Deputy Surveyor summoned to attend any Court, civil or criminal, for the purpose of giving evidence in his professional capacity as a Surveyor for each day he so attends (in addition to his reasonable travelling and living expenses), and to be taxed and payed in the manner by law provided with regard to the payment of witnesses attending such Court, five dollars.”

Page 34, line 26.—Leave out “eighty five” and insert “eighty seven.”

The said amendments, being read a second time, were agreed to.

*Ordered*, That the Bill be now read the third time.

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

*Resolved*, That the Bill, with the amendments, do pass.

*Ordered*, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Senate, and acquaint their Honors, That the House hath passed the same, with several amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

A Motion being made and seconded, That the Petition of the Corporation of the Town of *Cobourg*, presented on Wednesday last, praying for aid for the maintenance and improvement of the Harbor of *Cobourg*, be now received and read;

Bill intituled: “An Act to amend the Act 32 and 33 *Victoria*, Chapter 8.”

Bill intituled: “An Act to amend the Law relating to advertisements respecting “Stolen Goods.”

Bill intituled: “An Act to amend an Act of the present Session and to enable the Governor in Council to impose a duty on Tea and Coffee imported from the *United States* in the case therein mentioned.”

Bill intituled: “An Act to amend the Criminal Law relating to Violence, Threats and Molestation.”
