Ordered, That all the Members present during this Session be appointed a Committee to consider the Orders and Customs of this House and Privileges of Parliament, and that the said Committee have leave to meet in this House, when and as often as they please.

The Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell, Minister of Justice, informed the House that he had a Message from His Excellency the Governor General under his sign Manual, which His Excellency had commanded him to deliver to this House.

The same was then read by the Clerk, and it is as follows:—

The Governor General transmits to the Senate an agreement made at Victoria on the 20th day of August, 1883, relative to various points remaining unsettled between the Government of the Dominion and that of the Province, together with the contract for the construction of a Railway on the Island of Vancouver and accompanying papers, and recommends the same to the favourable consideration of your Honorable House.

The Committee of the Privy Council have had under consideration a Report herewith, dated 25th September, 1883, from Sir Alexander Compbell, who was
