and commodious for the passage of travellers, cattle and carriages; and if, within the time last mentioned, the said Bridge be not repaired or rebuilt, as the case may require, then the said Bridge, or such part thereof as shall be remaining, shall be, and be taken, and considered to be the property of Her Majesty; and after such default to repair or re- 5 build the said Bridge, the said William John Bickell shall cease to have any right, title, or claim in, or to the said Bridge, or to the remaining parts thereof, and the tolls hereby granted, and his, and each, and every of his rights in the premises, shall be wholly and for ever terminated.

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Enforcement of penalties.

10. The penalties hereby inflicted shall, upon proof of the offence, respectively, before any one or more Justices of the Peace for the District of Quebec, either by the confession of the offender or by the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses (which oath such Justice is hereby empowered and required to administer), be levied by distress 15 and sale of the goods and chattels of such offender, by warrant, signed by such Justice or Justices of the Peace, and the overplus, after such penalties and the charges of such distress and sale are deducted, shall be returned, on demand, to the owner of such goods and chattels; and one half of such penalties, respectively, when paid and levied, shall be-20 long to Her Majesty, and the other half to the person suing for the same.

Height of bridge.

11. The said Bridge to be built over the River St. Charles shall have under its arches an elevation of at least five feet above high water, and a distance of at least seventy-five feet between the several piers thereof 25

To be a swing bridge.

12. The said Bridge shall be a swing Bridge, and shall be so constructed as to admit of the free navigation, at all times, of the said River St. Charles, by vessels of every description capable of navigating the said river.

Indemnification of Quebec Turnpike Arust.

- 13. And with the view of preventing all differences between the 30 Quebec North Shore Turnpike Road Trust and the said John Bickell. it is enacted,-That in case the revenues derived from the Dorchester Bridge should be diminished in consequence of the construction of the new bridge, the said John Bickell shall be bound to indemnify the said Quebec North Shore Turnpike Road Trust in the manner following:
- 1. The said John Bickell shall every week deposit in one of the Incorporated Banks of this Province, all the tolls and revenues arising directly from the said new Bridge, which said tolls and revenues he shall not at any time withdraw, excepting upon his compliance with 40 the conditions following:
- 2. To enable them to ascertain whether any actual dimunition has taken place in the revenue of the Dorchester Bridge, the Turnpike Road Trustees shall prepare a Return at the end of every six months to be attested by them under oath shewing in detail all the revenues arising from tolls on the said Dorchester Bridge. 45
- 3. If it is ascertained by means of such return that the revenues derived from the Dorchester Bridge have actually diminished, the said Wm. John Bickell shall then indemnify the said Turnpike Trust out of the funds which he shall have deposited in one of the Incorporated Banks 50 of this Province, as hereinbefore prescribed, and after so doing he shall be at liberty to withdraw from the said Bank the moneys he shall have
