"Our defence was good," commented losing coach Jon Austin. "We held them to 49 points and they're a good basketball team. I had no complaints about that."

But Glenforest shot a dismal 16 per cent from the floor in the second half.

Doug Bell led Raiders in scoring for the second straight game with 12 points while centre John Howard hit for eight and Mark Stobart shot seven.

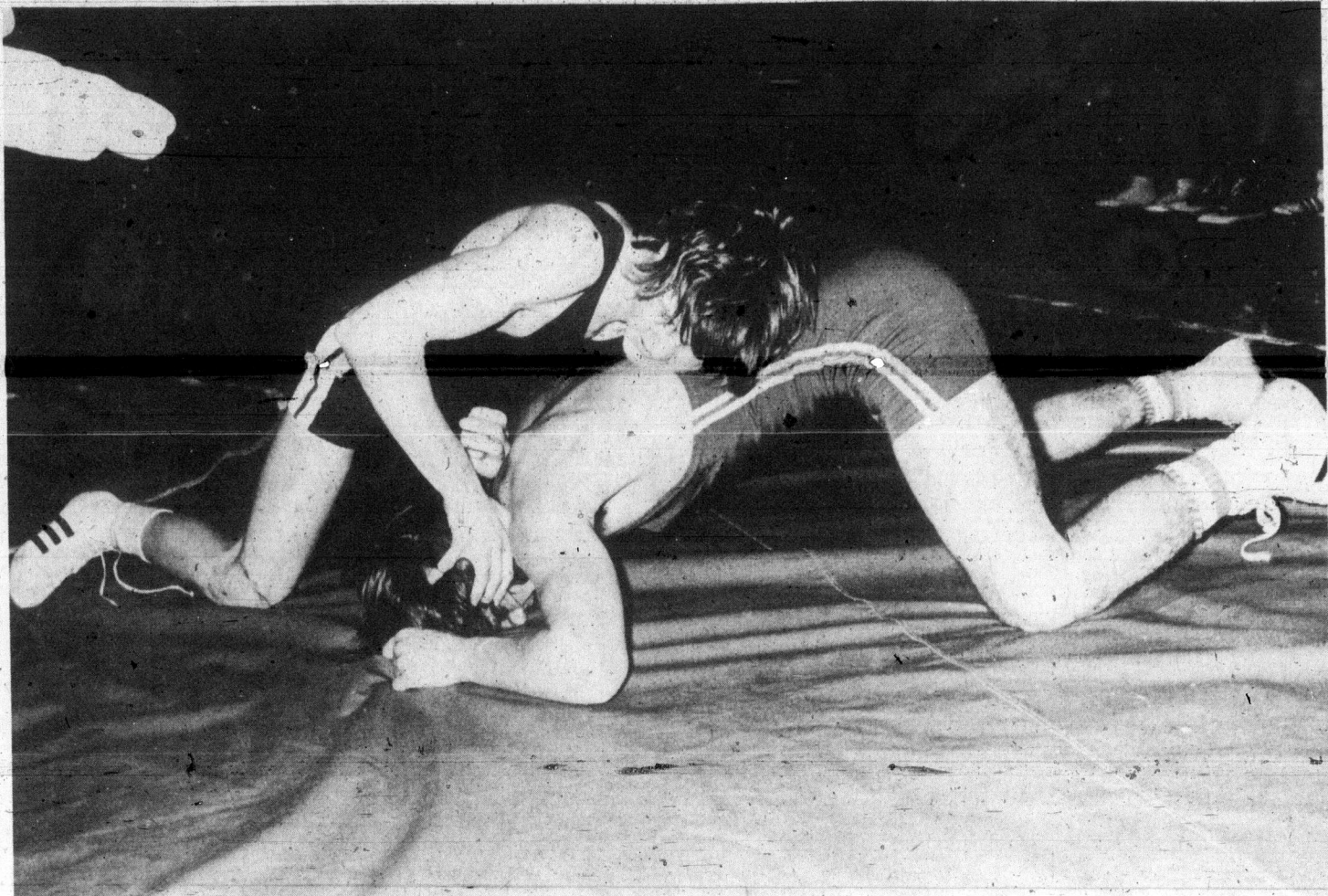
Bob Hutchings was the high man for Glenforest with 12 points despite the fact he failed to score in the second half. Jim Dziedzina, in the lineup for the first time this year, scored eight points and pulled down 11 rebounds.

Erindale's record is now 2-1 while the Gryphons are 1-2.

In a northern division battle between unbeaten teams Wednesday Central Peel defeated Westwood Wildcats at Westwood, 42-35. Helmut Rautenberg, last year's Peel junior high jump champion, led Centurions with 11 points. Six-foot-five inch Andre Graovak added 10.

Vic Risinger's nine points paced Wildcats. Claudio Manzato and Ken Toppin each managed eight points.

Two senior games scheduled for last Tuesday—Streetsville at Lorne Park and Mayfield at Brampton Centennial—were cancelled because of the teacher walkout to protest provincial Bill 274.

Erindale coach: wrestlers best in Metro area

Erindale Raiders won their own invitational wrestling meet Wednesday and in the process became the first Peel school to beat Georgetown in the last six years.

"I think it's the first time it's ever happened in the last few years," said wrestling coach Mike Thorpe who organized the meet of what he called "some of the best wrestling teams in Ontario." Erindale had 105 points in the meet with Georgetown registering 90, Aliston Banting 55 and Flesheron Grey Highlands 52.

Thorpe who says he's "not modest" about his team's chances for success this year says Erindale is probably the best wrestling school right now in the Metropolitan Toronto area.

He says the team is aiming first for the Peel championship and then the Peel-Halton which the coach

feels are within Raiders' grasp.

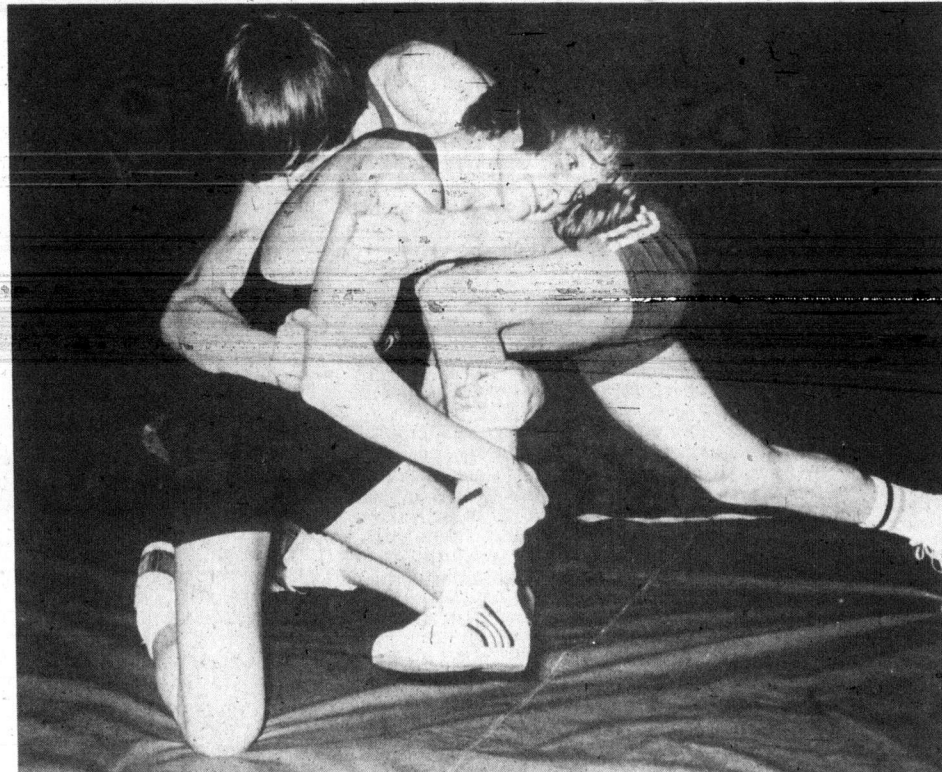
How about the possibility of an Ontario championship for Peel?

"Well it's in the Lakehead this year and they have some very tough competition up there," he says. "But I think we could finish in the top five."

The Raiders have not lost a dual school meet yet this year. They finished third in a recent tournament at Bishop Ryan in Hamilton.

They won the meet this week still without two of their first-string competitors including tough Ed Falconi who is considered to have an excellent chance to be Ontario champion in his weight division.

Four Erindale wrestlers went through this week's meet undefeated. They were Ron Newhook, 130 pounds, Mike Quinsey at 148, Larry Dallimore at 157 and John Viana at 178.
