
Ottawa, 21st December, 1914.

Madam,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 16th instant, asking if there are any funds now in the Department from the estate of your father for distribution.

In reply I beg to say that \$100 was received from Mr. Jones on the 2nd instant. Your brother, Louis, wrote the Department recently stating that he had paid accounts against the estate amounting to \$63.74, which should be now paid to him from the estate. There is also an account in favour of Messrs. Kyle & Hunter amounting to a balance of \$29.38 outstanding. The Department has referred these accounts to the Council of the Band to say whether they are correct and if so these accounts will have to be paid out of the monies on hand. Any balance that there may be after the payment of these account will be immediately distributed.
