having been duly sworn, states:

"I am K-57492 Sgt. Jobs, E., At approximately 1700 hours on the 3 AUG 45, I was informed by "B" Coy Orderly Room Sergeant that there had been a suspected theft in the billets. I proceeded to the billets with another member of the Regimental Police and in the presence of the A/QMMS of "B" Coy we inspected the man's kit. At the bottom of the accused's kit bag we found a carton of 300 cigarettes, which were addressed to one Pte. Hansen, G. I immediately placed Pte Quaw under arrest and held the cigarettes as evidence.

The witness recognized the evidence as being the cigarettes found in Pte. Quaw's kit bag.

The accused declined to cross-examine the witness.

"I am D-72086 Sgt. Robertson, D. W., A/QMMS of "B" Coy, 1st En C. Scot R. (Cda). On the 3 AUG 45, I ordered the accused to have a kit inspection and found in his possession a carton of 300 cigarettes, belonging to one Pte Hansen, G."

The accused declined to cross-examine the witness.
