

Q Do the Indians go there to fish?

A They stay there and fish at the point where the fish are.

Q How far is it away?

A About one or two miles.

Q Why did they put their shack there?

Q How many acres do you recommend there?

Q And he could not locate any traces of Indian occupation there?

A There was some black dirt which showed that a house was there at one time, but there was no recent sign of Indian occupation there.
