voting rights, in elections and community affairs, to be forfeited by the above mentioned head of the house until such time as all arrears in Poll Tax have been paid.

Money raised by this Poll Tax shall be used by the Council for the payment of watchmen for the village and for any other legal expense incurred in the upkeep of the village."

4. Resolved

"That a dog Tax of One Dollar (\$1.00) shall be levied annually in the month of January on all dog-owners in the village of Hartley Bay. Any owners refusing to pay above tax shall be forced by the Council to forfeit their dogs".

5. Resolved

"That no person under the age of seventeen (17) years shall handle or shoot a gun of any description on any Reserve connected with the Kitkahta Band of Hartley Bay".

6. Resolved

"That a tax of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50) to be known as a Store Tax shall be collected annually from all those who purchase goods and retail them to residents of the village.

This Store Tax to be imposed if necessary at the discretion of the Council".
