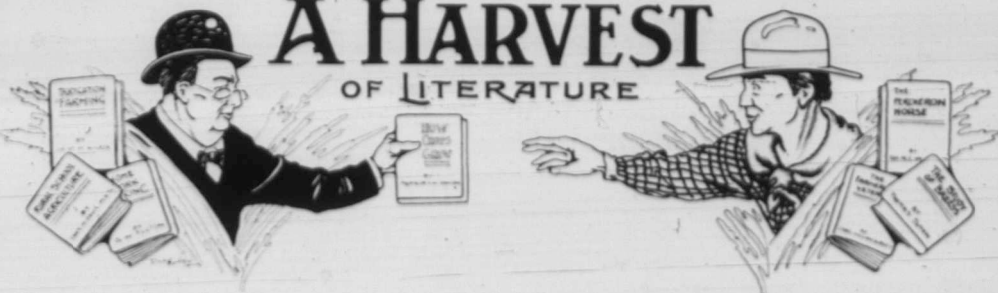


# A HARVEST OF LITERATURE
