to consolidate and further continue for a time, the provisions of two other Acts therein mentioned, for more effectually ascertaining the damages on protested Bills of Exchange, and for terminating disputes relating thereto, and for other purposes, shall remain in force (except in so far as it may be affected by any subsequent Act whether passed during the present or any other Session (until the first day of May, which will be in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fortyseven, and thence until the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.

And be it enacted, That the Ordinance of the said Legislature, passed in the third Session held in the second year of Her Majesty's Reign, and initialed, An Ordinance to amend the Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of the Reign of King George the Third, Chapter Nine, commonly called the Road Act, shall remain in force (except in so far as it may be affected by any subsequent Act or Ordinance whether passed during the present or any other Session,) until the first day of May, which will be in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and thence until the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.
