

The Order of the Day for the House in Committee on the Bill, from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to enable *Philip Pearson Harris* to obtain a Patent for a "Machine for refining and deodorizing Crude Petroleum Oil," being read;

And the Question being put, That Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair; the House divided:—And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee; and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. *Scatcherd* reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made an amendment thereunto.

*Ordered*, That the Report be now received.

Mr. *Scatcherd* reported the Bill accordingly; and the amendment was read, as followeth:—

Page 1, line 32.—After "operation" insert the following as Clause A:—

Clause A.—"Before any patent is granted under this Act, the petitioner shall give "one month's notice in the *Official Gazette* of his intention to apply for the same, stating "therein the name of the original inventor, the date of the Patent obtained in the *United States*, and such other particulars as will sufficiently identify the invention."

The said amendment, being read a second time, was agreed to.

*Ordered*, That the Bill be read the third time, on Thursday next.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill to incorporate the Queen's College of Physicians and Surgeons, *Kingston*; and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. *Cartwright* reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and directed him to report the same, without any amendment.

*Ordered*, That the Bill be read the third time, on Thursday next.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill to enable *Casimir Stanislaus Gzowski* and the Honorable *David Lewis Macpherson* to obtain Letters Patent for the invention of certain improvements in treating certain ores and alloys, and in obtaining metals and other products therefrom; and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. *White* reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made amendments thereunto.

*Ordered*, That the Report be now received.

Mr. *White* reported the Bill accordingly; and the amendments were read and agreed to.

*Ordered*, That the Bill be read the third time, on Thursday next.

The Clerk of the Legislative Council delivered, at the Bar of the House, the following Message:—

The Legislative Council have passed the following Bills, without any amendment:—

Bill, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the *Globe Printing Company*."

Bill, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the "*Institut des Artizans Canadiens de Montréal*."

Bill, intituled, "An Act to amend the Law relating to Crown Debtors in *Upper Canada*."

Bill, intituled, "An Act to amend the Common Law Procedure Act of *Upper Canada*."

And then he withdrew.

The House resumed the adjourned Debate upon the amendment which was, on Friday last, proposed to be made to the Question, That the First Resolution (on the subject of the Local Governments and Legislatures of *Upper* and *Lower Canada*) be now read a second time; and which amendment was, That the words "and it is further now resolved, that in "the opinion of this House, the appointment of the first Lieutenant Governor should be "provisional, and that he should hold office strictly during pleasure," be added at the end thereof.

And the Question being put on the amendment; it was resolved in the Affirmative.

Then, the main Question, so amended, being put; the House divided:—And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The First Resolution, as amended, was accordingly read a second time.
