LONDON, Oct. 28.—The racing yacht Germania which on two other occasions, won Emperor William's Cup at Cowes, was condemned in a Prize Court to-day as a Prize of War.

The Germania was captured at Cowes on the outbreak of the war. Three other yachts, captured at Cowes, were also condemned.

**Railway
Communication
Re-established**

PARIS, Oct. 28.—The Havas Agency's correspondent at Athens sends word that railway communication between Salonika and Veles has been re-established and that literally a train going a long distance northward from Veles encountered no Bulgarian troops.

**Donnacona Foundered
Was Not Torpedoed**

MONTREAL, Oct. 28.—According to advices reaching Montreal, the Lake boat Donnacona foundered in mid-Atlantic, and was not torpedoed by a German submarine as at first reported.

The crew took to the boats and were saved.

**Twenty Children Lose
Their Lives by Fire**

PEABODY, Mass. Oct. 28.—Twenty children, most of them girls, ranging in age from seven to seventeen years, lost their lives to-day by a fire which destroyed St. John's parochial school.

Many other girls were severely hurt.

**Pope Gives \$5000 To
Polish Relief Fund**

BERLIN, Oct. 28.—The announcement that Pope Benedict has donated \$5,000 to the Polish Relief Fund, was made by the Overseas News Agency to-day.

The C.C.C. will parade to last Mass at the Cathedral Sunday, and will be inspected on the College Campus by His Grace Archbishop Roche.

**Russians Forces Will
Be Well Supplied
With Ammunition**

PARIS, Oct. 25.—There will be no delay in munitions reaching Russia because of weather conditions and the shortage of this spring will not again be experienced. Last winter the port of Archangel was closed.

A message from Petrograd says that the railway from the Russian capital to Ekaterina, a port in the Arctic which is free from ice throughout the year will be open for war traffic at the beginning of November. This new line has been built by an army of 10,000 men, mostly prisoners having been employed upon it.

Ekaterina is on the northern coast of the Gulf of Kola, where large docks and sheds have been constructed. This new railway, with double lines, is 1,220 miles long, and has been built in six months.

Mystery Solved

NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 24.—A fashionably-dressed young woman, whose identity had puzzled police and authorities at a hospital here, to which she was admitted in a delirious condition, was identified by Tommy Burns (Noah Burso), formerly heavyweight champion of the world, as his wife.

Burns said she had not recovered from the shock of a recent serious illness.

Grace Building For Sale

A few days ago an auction sale was called on the Grace Building on Water St. by auctioneer P. C. O'Driscoll. The upset price was \$18,000 but there was no bidders. This fine new building is freehold property, but money is close and investors seem to be few.

BULGARIANS REPULSED

MILAN, Oct. 28.—The "Secolo" announces the Bulgarians have been repulsed in the Timok Valley, after two days desperate fighting. One of their regiments is surrounded between the Timok and the Danube and will be obliged to surrender.

Two Serbian divisions, under General Glokowitch are marching against the Austro-Germans.

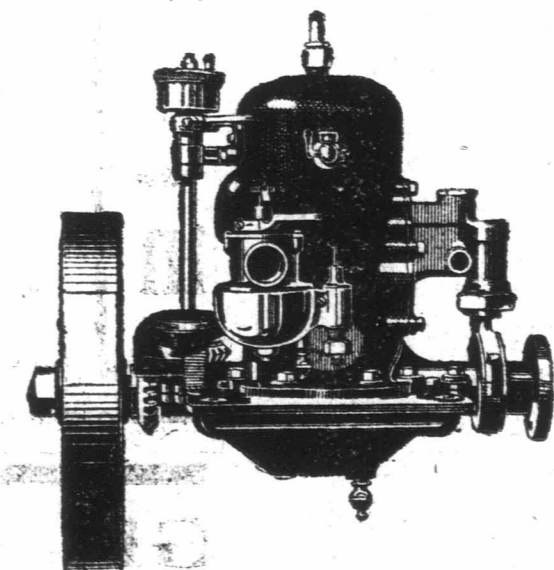
