TRIBUNALS SIT TODAY

Exemption Boards Through City and County Hold First Session
 Nine military service tribunals throughout Brant County, four of which are located in the city, commenced their sittings this morning when the first applicants for exemption from service made personal and oral appeals. The tribunals opened early and before 10 o'clock draftees began to file in to have their cases examined.
 In some cases decision was deferred, in others, absolutely refused and in a few granted. Careful inquiry was made into each case, and a thorough investigation was made of each claim. Disability, indispensability and domestic situations that required their presence at home were brought forward most frequently.
 The rush of applicants was not very heavy this morning, but the numbers are expected to increase tomorrow and Saturday, after which written applications will come up for consideration.
 The military representatives were on hand and while they did not take a very active part, represented the military authorities.

CHINESE BANDITS FIRED ON U. S. SHIP

American Gunboat Dalos, Slightly Damaged on Yangtse Kiang

 Pekin, Nov. 8.—The American gunboat Dalos was fired upon yesterday by Chinese bandits on the Yangtse Kiang, near Chung-King, in the Province of Sze-Chuan. The gunboat was damaged slightly.

The Dalos, of 190 tons, is one of a number of small gunboats which have been in Chinese waters for some time. In June the Dalos, Monacaey, Samar, Quiros and Villalobos were interned in the harbor of Shanghai by the Chinese Government. They were released subsequently when China broke off diplomatic relations with Germany. Ching-King is about 800 miles up the Yangtse Kiang from Shanghai.

FRENCH INFLECT LOSSES ON ENEMY

Two Surprise Attacks on the German Trenches Made Last Night
 By Courier Leased Wire
 Paris, Nov. 8.—During the night we made two surprise attacks, one on the enemy trenches east of Rheims, the other in the Woodville east of Noully, and brought back prisoners," says today's official statement. "In Upper Alsace the attack which we made yesterday on the German positions at Schoenholz, it is now learned, caused the enemy to suffer heavy losses. The number of prisoners captured by us has reached 121, of whom two are officers. Important materials, which we have thus far not been able to enumerate, fell into our hands.
 "There is nothing to report from the remainder of the front."

U. S. STEAMER SUNK

 The captain and 22 men have landed at Buenarara. One lifeboat with nine survivors reached Rosspoint in the County of Mayo yesterday.

U. S. VESSEL SANK SUB.

 An Atlantic Port, Nov. 8.—Information that a shell fired by an American naval gunner sank a Teutonic submarine in the Mediterranean sea is contained in a report that has been made to the Navy Department by the officers of an American freight steamship, which has arrived here. The vessel was returning from an Italian port in ballast.

BOMBER ARRESTED.

St. Paul, Minn., Nov. 7.—A man giving the name of John Hitchler, was arrested last night in connection with the wrecking by a bomb of the parish home of St. Agnes German Catholic church on Sunday. According to the police, Hitchler confessed to throwing the bomb.

STUDENTS EXEMPTED.

 Montreal, Nov. 7.—Dr. L. D. Mignault announced to Laval University students yesterday that exemption from the terms of the Military Service Act had been granted by the government to students of medical, veterinary, and dental faculties.

AN INCREASE ASKED.

Washington, Nov. 8.—Anthracite operators at a conference with miners here yesterday asked an increase in wages similar to that recently awarded bituminous workers. They issued no ultimatum.
 As the result of this conference a joint committee was named by the two elements which will gather today to reach an agreement or understanding, if possible to settle the question.

PRO-GERMAN BEATEN.

 Union City, Ind., Nov. 8.—Fred Toepfer was taken from his home here late last night by a crowd of men, blindfolded, driven 12 miles into the country and severely beaten for alleged pro-German statements. He was not seriously injured and managed to free himself from a tree to which he was tied. At the beginning of the European war, it is said, Toepfer sold 100 iron crosses at \$1 each for the benefit of German war funds.

UNION IN YUKON.

 Ottawa, Nov. 8.—Dr. Alfred Thompson, ex-member for the Yukon has been advised by the government of his nomination as the union candidate for the Yukon territory. Dr. Thompson, who is superintendent of military hospitals for soldiers, invalided home, was first elected to the House of Commons at the general election in 1904. He was not a candidate in 1908, but was elected again in 1911.
MIGHT IS RIGHT.

 Washington, Nov. 8.—How thoroughly Germanized Bulgaria has become since her entry into the war on the side of the Teutonic powers, is evidenced by a speech made recently by the vice-president of the Bulgarian parliament, discussing the motives of war. Notes of this speech received here contain this question:
 "This war has proved better than anything else ever did that might makes right. Might is right. Bulgaria is proud to be the sincere ally of Germanic powers."
 This declaration was received with enthusiastic applause on the part of the Bulgarian parliament.

 The recipe for Cheese Balls, mentioned above, is as follows:
 Cheese: Set a quart of sour milk into a pan of warm water, and leave until the curd is set and the whey separates. Strain off the whey through a cheese cloth. Season the cheese with salt and pepper and a little salad dressing. Roll into a ball, and if desired add some chopped nuts.

Nearly a score of occupants of rooms on the third and fourth floors of the hotel were burned, none of them seriously.
