HAVE HONOR IN THEIR OWN CITY

Evangelists Crossley and Hunter Highly Appreciated in St. Thomas.

The following ministers occupied seats on the platform at last night's evangelistic services: Revs. Crews, St. Thomas; Shaw, Detroit; Malott, Idle, the local Methodist pastors, and the evangelists, Rev. H. W. Crews, M. A., pastor of Central Methodist church, St. Thomas, which is also known as the Crossley-Hunter church, gave a short address and in eulogistic terms spoke of the evangelists, their work, and high esteem in which they are held by the people of the Railroad City, Messrs. Crossley and Hunter are evidently exceptions to the rule, that prophets are without honor in their own city.

Mr. Crossley sang several solos, and preached an earnest sermon from the words, found in Jer. 8 chap. and 20th verse, "The harvest is past, the summer is ended and I am not saved." In appealing to those to whom the two last words of his text applied, Mr. Crossley said, how glorious a thing it is to be saved, pardon, peace, purity, and pleasures unfading in this life, and in the world to come life everlasting, was the present and future inheritance of those who were saved. Mr. Hunter spoke of the "evils of idleness," he believed that thou shalt labor six days a week, is as much a command of God, as that "On the seventh thou shalt rest." "There is no need of idleness, opportunities for work abundant as the minutes of the day lie thick around us. The preacher admonished the Christians present to remember that the world was waiting to be invited to Christ, and how important it was that each follower of Jesus should be up and doing. Time was passing so quickly, souls are perishing, and we Christians stand idly by.

Park St. Church will undoubtedly be crowded to the doors to-night, to hear the "Parlor Dance," discussed by the evangelists.
