The provincial parliament has no right to look upon a portion of the people as disloyal. For disloyal and anyone is who lives and votes in a country which he cannot see honored with pleasure. The manner in which the Dominion was formed does not enter into the question of loyalty in the least. It is the native land of every Nova Scotian and as such demands of him perfect loyalty. If he finds himself unable to be loyal to his country he is in honor bound to seek some other. The government by thus hinting publicly that disloyalty in our province is common, and excusable as well cansot fall to exercise an unpatriotic influence on our citizens. No greater stimulas to growth does such an evil require than recognition.
