lew Calculating Device, which will Supplant Plan and Elevation Drawing Invented by

Chatham Pay

Canadian Patent rights have been granted to Wm. Craig for a new calculating device, which will supplement that part of geometri-cal designing known as plan and elevation drawing as applied to heet metal work. The tool is eally a combination of square protractors, rule and a flexible gauge, and it is believed its use will practically do away with the customary methods of obtaining measurements from drawings.

These methods are tedious and require much time, while this new calculating device will give more accurate results in less than one quarter the time and by very simple manipulation.

The rule contains graduations which make the calculating of diameters, circumferences, squares and their respective properties very simple. Various arithmetical problems in fractions and mixed numbers (decimals included) can BURLADS ETC. be very quickly solved with the


