CHRISTMAS RENDEZVOUS

The Charlottetown Conference of St. Vincent de Paul Society held their annual meeting and election of officers in St. Dunstan's Cathedral on Sunday afternoon last. The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: -Rev. E.K. Gallant, Spiritual Director, (re-elected); John Caven, President, (re-elected); J. G. Robb, Vice-President, (re-elected); Hon. A. A. Macdonald, Lieut. Governor, Treasurer, (re-elected); Peter McIntyre, Assistant Treasurer, (re-elected); Henry Fitzgerald, Secretary, (re-elected); Alfred R. Macdonald, Assistant Secretary, (re-elected). The reports of the Secretary and Treasurer were submitted, and short addresses were made by His Honor Lieutenant Governor Macdonald, Treasurer of the Society; Rev. Father Gallant and Mr. Caven, President of the Society. The Treasurer's report showed that the Conference received, in cash, during the year, \$267.01, and paid out \$206.02, leaving a balance on hand of \$61.99. No more worthy labor could be engaged in than that to which this Society apply themselves in relieving the poor and distressed; and all who are possessed of worldly means should strengthen their hands of the members by placing at their disposal whatever they can in the shape of provisions, coal, cast-off clothing, or money. They may be very sure that whatever they give in this way will be most judiciously expended, and they shall reap a reward a hundred-fold. The members are much indebted to Owen Connolly, Esq., who, during last year, placed at the disposal of the society one hundred tons of coal, besides a number of blankets, and intends to do so some time this winter.
