

FIRE AT TORONTO.

Loss of the Property Destroyed by the Great Fire.

A most welcome note to the public is that the loss of the property destroyed by the great fire is estimated at \$10,000,000.

Toronto, Aug. 2.—One of the most destructive fires that has ever taken place in Toronto commenced about 12:30 this morning in the large brick building erected by the Toronto Sugar Refining Company on the Esplanade. Strong wind was blowing from the east and carried chunks of burning timber along the Esplanade, lighting wooden buildings as far west as five or six blocks. In a short time nothing was left of the sugar refinery but the bare walls and smoke stack. The following are among the properties consumed or damaged:

The ginhouse factory, owned by a syndicate composed of A. T. Fulton, John L. L. L., Geo. J. J., W. B. B., the estate of James Smith & Co., and others. The building, which was eight stories high and of brick, cost six years ago over \$300,000. The syndicate, it is said, purchased it for a mere song, and were making preparations to manufacture gloves, starch, spices, etc., on a large scale.

The schooner *Admiral Mulvey*. Rogers' coal docks, with several hundred tons of coal. Thomas Sauter's bathhouse. A. Evans' bathhouse. S. R. Heaker's bathhouse. J. Gussell's bathhouse. J. Johnson's bathhouse. Reid & Co.'s lumber yard. Walsh, James & Co.'s boiler works. The corporation wharf. The Wiman swimming baths. Mrs. M. Remondson's bathhouse. Hamilton & Sons' elevator. G. & J. Warren's boat house. Joseph Adamson's ice house. J. O'Grady's ice house. R. Williams' roofing works. Wm. Polson & Co.'s engine works. J. G. Baird's wharf and elevator. J. O'Grady's blacksmith shop. The buildings in Lionel York's stone yard.

Valo & Van's four barrel factory.

The Ontario Tanners' Supply company's factory. O. Wilson & Son's scale factory. J. Adamson's wharf. St. Lawrence wharf. J. Simington's cigar box manufactory.

Wm. Adamson's wharf. S. Crane & Co.'s coal docks. Sylvester Bros. & Hickman's wharf. Denogh & O'Leary's lumber yard. J. R. Bailey & Co.'s coal docks. The fleet of ferry steamers at the foot of Church street were nearly all destroyed. Also the stone booke's Madeline and Mary Ann. The buildings between Church and Yong streets—the Bayview rowing club house, Cook, Jones and Inglis' rowing club house, Geo. Lamb's fruit market, Hamilton's wharf, Mrs. Givens' bathhouse, D. G. Givens' bathhouse, P. Burn's coal docks, and Milroy's wharf—were not so much damaged as those to the east of them.

This list of properties are all more or less damaged, many of them completely.

About 3:30 o'clock rain began to fall slowly and at this hour the fire was completely under control.

A prominent insurance man was viewing the ruins about 3:30 o'clock. He was asked by a question by a *World* reporter what he estimated the total loss at \$100,000. On this, he said, there would be an insurance of about \$175,000.

Toronto, Aug. 3.—The further progress of the fire on the Esplanade was checked shortly after 3 this morning, but not before four pleasure steamers—the *Amie*, *Ontario*, *Theresa* and *Mamie*—had been burned to the water's edge. From Church street wharf to Frederick street—five blocks—there is nothing to be seen but a smouldering mass of ruins. It is a matter of great surprise that a number of lives were not lost, several steamers and citizens being more than once in imminent danger of being cut off by the flames. It is impossible to give anything like a list of losses and insurances. Several of the sufferers are frantic with grief and refuse to give any information. Every insurance company in the city is said to be a loser. *McCallum*, the steamer, will recover. The body of the watchman has not been found.

THE LOSSES.

As per assessments in the city books are: Sugar refinery, \$60,000; Thomas Sauter, \$100; A. Evans \$400; Elias Rogers, \$1,200; S. R. Heaker, \$500; John Gussell, \$1,000; Geo. Reid & Co., \$6,500; Warrin's boat house, \$400; William Burn's ice house, \$900; J. A. Graham's ice house, \$900; Wilson's scale factory, \$2,700; John Simington's factory, \$800; Chapman's elevator, \$3,000; Adamson's elevator, \$4,000; Denogh & O'Leary's buildings, \$1,000; John K. Bailey's coal docks, \$4,000; total, \$93,000.

The loss on the contents of buildings is heavy. Mr. Polson will lose \$20,000; Wilson & Co. will probably approach \$15,000; Crane & Co. had 4,000 tons of coal in stock, insured; J. R. Bailey had 20,000 tons, insured; about half its value. Neil Cutler & Co. cannot yet estimate their loss. Ald. Hall valued the burned *Mulvey* at \$4,000. The steamers *Amie*, *Ontario* and *Mamie* are valued at \$10,000. The losses of *Donogh & O'Leary* and *Sylvester Bros.* cannot yet be accurately fixed. Geo. J. Warrin, the boat builder, loses \$2,500. In Chapman's elevator 19,000 bushels of grain were stored. In Adamson's 12,000 bushels of oats and 25,000 bushels of wheat will be a total loss. The losses of *Mamie*, *Theresa*, *Sauter*, *Simington*, *Goldstein* and other small sufferers will bring the totals up to over \$180,000.

The ginhouse factory originally cost nearly \$100,000. It was sold to its late owner for \$40,000. It was insured for \$60,000.

Lace and embroidery are being used in lavish abundance upon children's costumes of lawn and tulle.
