

In reading of the pr lis Excellency's visit it struck me ose of Carbonear was very marked.

Every loyal Newfoundlander must ppreciate and endorse the foreught and diplomacy of the Harbor patriotism of its boys at the front and in the navy. Better still in perpetua ting the memory of the noble lads who have given their lives in their country's service by having the brave mothers of those noble men presented to His Excellency from whom they received words of comfort. This thoughtful and diplomatic action upon the part of the Hart Lace Committee tends to foster the patriotic and self-sacrificing spirit, and one does not wonder at the response to the call for King and Country from that patriotic

So far as one could judge of the actions of the Carbonear Committee there was not the slightest attempt made to recognize the patriotic and noble spirit of the boys in khaki and blue from this old town, while the noble mothers were alike unrecognized. No one in Carbonear wonders at the poor response to appeals for recruits In this district for this is an example of the proceedings of all attempts at recruiting and they all spring from

His Excellency went away from Carbonear with the impression that we were a community of shirkers and our representative Mr. Goodison told us publicly for the first time "he was ashamed of us." I wonder why Mr. Goodison is not ashamed to accept his cheque every quarter for the "hard work" he puts in for King and Country, "and which he owes to Carbonear District."

There are families in Carbonear who have 4 sons out of 5, 3 out of 4, 2 out of 3, and one only son at the front. There are spots in Gallipoli and France sacred in memory to

mothers and fathers of Carbonear. If old Carbonear is not as well represented as it should be in the army and navy there is a branch of the service in which we have a good representation. The sailors of Carbonear, second to none, are doing a full share in manning our foreign-going vessels which is a very necessary service at the present time. Take Carbonear sailors and master mariners from our foreign going vessels to-day and the owners would need to do some recruiting. Old Neptune is taking large toll of those seamen this season and there are mothers in Carbonear to-day with broken hearts because of the boys who are quietly slumbering in

ocean depths. I trust Carbonear will respond bet ter to the next appeal for recruits and that those who take upon themselves public duties will develop a larger heartedness and sacrifice a little of their domineering selfish spirit which will allow the public to discern some

### **Newfoundland Scotch** Cured Herring.

The almost complete exhaustion of

Newfoundland Scotch cured herring in the New York market has had little effect upon conditions here, there being little demand for this grade at present. Merchants report that they have had few inquiries since the sinking of the steamer Florizel off Cape Race with a large quantity of this grade. It is apparent that the Lenten season has had some influence upon the market also. New supplies of fall Newfoundland herring are on the way to this market on the steamer Prospero, which left St. John's on Tuesday, and it is expected that with her arrival there will be a renewed interest in this trade. Quotations have seen little or no changes since last reports, although importers have given evidence of their intention to advance prices. Recent sales have been on the basis of \$27 and \$28 per barrel, while in some instances \$30 has been asked for large fancy fish. The supply coming forward via the steamer Prospero will probably clean up the holdings of several New York importers, although it is understood that there is a liberal quantity yet to be shipped from the outports when navigation is resumed this spring. Other cargoes are also reported to be on the way here. The supply of New-foundland Scotch cured herring is reported to be of fair average. The to-tal pack at Bay of Islands is reported to have been 17,000 barrels, while the total catch was approximately 32,000 barrels. Prices pre St. John's at present are \$22 and \$23, according to reports received this week.—N. Y. Fishing Gazette, March
