STREET FIGHTING IN BELFAST

Street fighting of a most savage character continued in this city last night, following a day of disorder. The day's rioting and outlawry culminated at nine o'clock in the appearance of a party of men, armed with rifles, who entered Stanhope Street, took positions on the grounds and opened a hot fire. Pedestrians stampeded from the fusilade. Exchange of shots between contending parties began early in the morning and gradually spread over an extensive area with increasing intensity During a fusilade on North Queen Street in the afternoon two persons were killed and a dozen wounded. An armored car was sent to the scene to stop the fighting. Outside of detachments in armored cars, the military forces of the Gevernment have no interferred in the rioting.
