The boy monarch apparently has no desire to return to power n China. He was only seven years old when, as the choice of the famous old dowager Empress Lung Yu. he was placed on the throne. He had no opportunity of tasting power. The revolution came a few years later and he was obliged to resign the government before he scarcely knew what the action meant. He retains the throne and title with the consent of the Republican Government. He still holds the respect of the Chinese people and the terms of the abdication are such that a fairly pleasant future


