UNUSUAL NEW YORK CHILDREN. By DR. ALBERT LOYAL CRANE, Consulting Psychologist.

A modest genius seems the most fitting term wherewith to describe Edward Lumsden of Staten Island. While my attention was first turned in young Lumsden's direction when he was declared the winner of the New York State American Legion essay contest, closer acquaintance with him proved that this honor was but one of a series of distinctions with which he has covered himself in recent years, although perhaps the most noteworthy, in view of the fact that young Lumsden chose as his theme a topic in American history, though he was born in London, England, and has been but four years a resident of this country.

The subject of the winning essay was: "The Inauguration of George Washington as First President of the United States. Its Significance and Bearing Upon the Affairs of the World To-day."

At Curtis High School, Lumsden's record gives further proof of his literary scholarly capacities. Member of the Senior Artists, he is also editor-in-chief of the school magazine. Nor is this student so absorbed in intellectual pursuits as to lose interest in the humbler tasks of life, as witness his services at the lunch counter, on the programme committee, as usher at commencement and as private secretary to a member of the faculty.

And of all his works young Lumsden has kept accurate record in a diary, for many years written in Spanish but now conducted in French. Truly such scribbling must bring success.

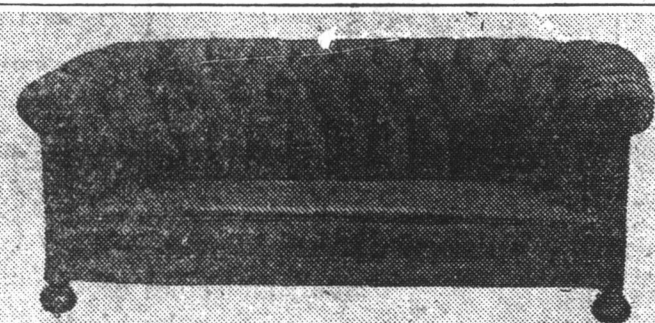
