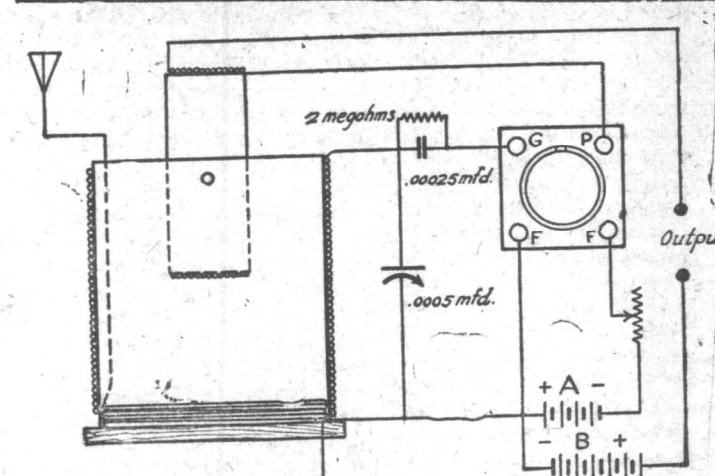
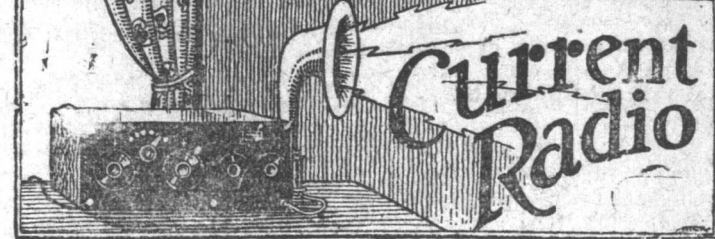

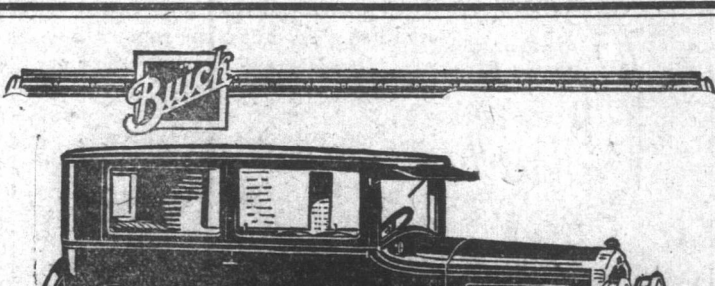
D downfall of Herriot's Cabinet
Seems InevitableUnionists Have Majority in Ulster Elec-
tions.--Canada Uses the Axe in Her
Civil Service.--France Proposes to Tax
Capital.DOWNFALL OF HERRIOT PRE-
DICTED.
PARIS, April 6.
The French Cabinet crisis cannot
be avoided more than a week longer,
political observers predicted to-night,
because of the conflict raging within
the Herriot Cabinet over methods for
a general overhauling of French fin-
ances.UNIONISTS IN CONTROL.
BELFAST, April 5.
With red flags flying, a triumphal
procession which until recently would
have caused a riot swept through the
heart of the city to-day, celebrating
the victory of three Socialist candi-
dates for the Ulster Parliament. Only
three Unionists were put forward out
of all were elected. Premier James
Craig, however, maintains control in
the Ulster Government, despite unex-
pected loss of Unionist ranks.
With only 100 seats to be heard from the
new Ulster House will consist of 32
Unionists, 10 Nationalists, 2 Republi-
cans, 4 Independents, 3 Labor and one
member from the Tenant party.COUNTERFEITERS SENTENCED.

action by the Palestine authorities
prevented serious trouble on Balfour's
visit to Palestine to open the new
Jewish University on Mount Scopus.REDUCING CANADA'S CIVIL SER-
VICE.
OTTAWA, April 6.
The Journal this afternoon says
some 1200 civil servants are in pro-
cess of being eliminated from the Fed-
eral Government payroll as the re-
sult of the absorption of the income
tax branch of the debt finance by
the Customs Dept. The annual salar-
ies involved aggregate some \$1,500,000.SLASHED WIFE AND SUICIDED.
HALIFAX, N.S., April 6.
Edward Parker, aged 50, a prosper-
ous farmer at Hillsdale, Haat's Co.,
about 30 miles from here, slashed his
wife's throat with a penknife this
morning severing the external jugu-
lar vein and then committed suicide
by drowning in Meander River, sev-
eral hundred yards distant. Mrs. Par-
ker may recover. Parker had been
unwell for several years.A LABOR PROBLEM.
LONDON, April 6.
When the Independent Labor Par-
ty's convention meets in Gloucester
on Easter Monday, a report will be
submitted by a committee which has
been considering how that ancient

can be practically set out.BIGGER SALARIES FOR ONTARIO
LEGISLATORS.
TORONTO, April 6.
The Ontario Legislature this after-
noon gave a second reading to a Bill
providing \$600 increase in salary for
its members and \$2,000 increase in
salary of Cabinet Ministers. There
was some opposition from the Pro-
gressives, but they did not divide the
House on the question.PRINCE AT FREETOWN.
FREETOWN, Sierra Leone, West
Africa, April 6.—The Prince of Wales
arrived here to-day. H.M.S. Repulse,
the battle cruiser on which he is mak-
ing the tour to Africa and South America,
anchored in the early hours of
a sultry morning. Main street of the
town was elaborately beflagged and
patient crowds waited in serried
ranks along the waterfront for weary
hours in wondering expectation at the
cruiser with all her colors flying. The
Prince awaited an opportunity to stay
ashore one night as the guest of the
Governor. His landing at 10 o'clock
was the signal for "similar" ovations
as greeted him at Bathurst.DIAMOND ROBBERY.
NEW YORK, April 6.
James Ross, a diamond merchant,
was robbed of fifty thousand dollars
worth of unset diamonds as he ascend-
ed the steps of a building near Times
Square. He was waylaid by highway-
men.SOWING WHEAT.
LETHBRIDGE, April 6.
Seeding operations started full blast
throughout Southern Alberta, this
morning. Actual seeding of wheat is
reported from Burdette. Soil mois-
ture conditions were described as the
best since 1915, but the wheat acreage
in southeast Alberta will be the small-
est in ten years.FRANCE TO TAX CAPITAL.
PARIS, April 6.
Bills providing for an increase in
the bank note circulation amounting
to four billion francs and for volun-
tary ten per cent. contribution by
capital, were presented to the Cab-
inet this morning by M. Demenle, the
new Finance Minister. A meeting will
be held to-night to finish discussion
of these measures which will be pre-

Using That Old Vario-Coupler

EDITED BY JOHN M. CLAYTON.

If you have an out-of-date vario-
coupler and a .00025 or .0005 MFD
variable condenser sitting on the shelf
you can revamp them for use in a very
good one-tube regenerative set with
very little trouble.The secondary (or rotor) of the
vario-coupler will be used as the
tickler. It should be rewound so
that it has a total of some 25 turns
of wire. The size does not matter
particularly so long as it is not
smaller than No. 28 B. & S. gauge.
If you have more than 25 turns on
the present rotor strip it down until
there are only this number left. The
stationary coil form of the coupler.
If you have a diameter of the vari-
coupler will be used as the second-
ary. If this coil has a diameter of
4 inches it should have 40 turns of
