Mr. and Mrs. Austin Winters and Mr. and Mrs. E. Vincent spent Sunday at Hyde Park.

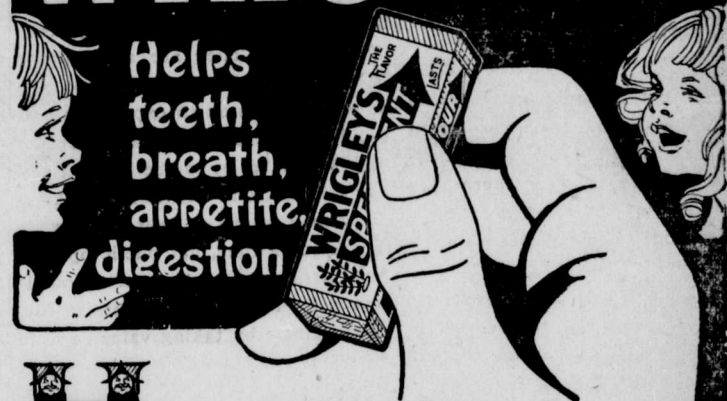
Monday's rain put a damper on the seeding for a few days.

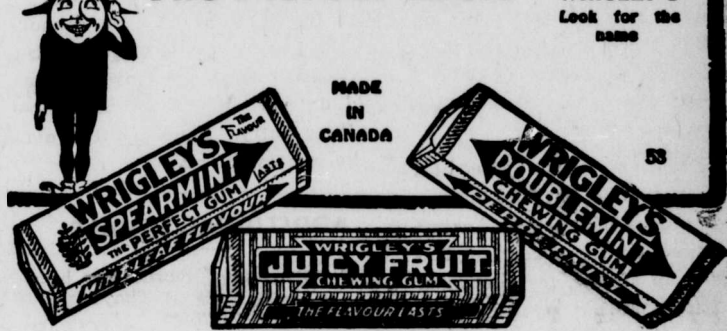

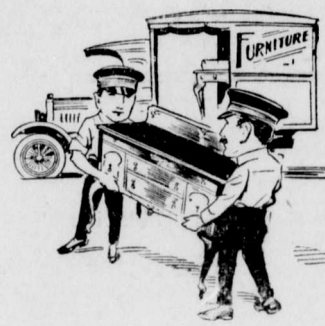
