A SPLENDID FIGHT AGAINST WHITE PAGUE

Infirmary at the Sanatorium Is Crowded, But Accommodation Is To Be Increased.

A regular meeting of the members of the London Health Association was held on Saturday afternoon, at which the reports of Dr. Bruce, superintendent of the Byron Sanatorium for Consumptives, and the visiting nurse who is engaged in London and St. Thomas

were received. The infirmary at the hospital is now rowded to its capacity, but arrangements were made to alleviate the sit uation. The work of the nurse is developing rapidly, and much good i being done in the fight against the white plague. In St. Thomas efforts were put forward to have a dispen-sary established in connection with the board of health of that city, but the feeling prevailed there that such a department was unnecessary. The people of St. Thomas were evidently under the impression that the city is in a very healthy condition, but a number of cases of tubercolisis were discovered by the nurse, who assisted he patients to a very great extent. The Sanatorium is not yet on a self-upporting basis, but is said to be proressing very favorably.



Rev. Harper Gary's Powerful Sermon in the First Presbyterian Church.

AND LAZARUS DIVES

The Story of the Rich and the Poor Brought Home to Londoners on Sunday Night.

At the First Presbyterian Church on Sunday night Rev. Harper Gary, pastor of Old St. Andrew's Church, Toronto, delivered a most impressive sermon on "Poverty and Riches." The story was recited by Luke, the poetpainter of the evangelists. To him the church is indebted for most of the parables, which are told by an artist. The meaning of the parable is often mistaken. For instance, it was not Luke's intention to tell the secrets of the prison house in the other world. The writer used the language of the Jewish underworld of his time. It furnished the drapery, the setting, the scenery of the little drama.

The first portion, or scene of this dramatic story, was in the form of a tableau. The story of a rich man, with mansions, and servants, and all that so to form a luxurious life were told. Dives never did anything true or noble or great. He was rich. Without the house, blistering in the sun, destitute and in rags, sat the beggars.
