TO SAVE POISONED DOGSDr. John F. Wood, of Nova
Scotia, Touched by Stories
of Animals' Deaths.To the Editor of The Advertiser:
With your permission would you be
good enough to publish the following
for the benefit of "Dog Fanciers" in
home town. Having noticed in your
issue of July 6 the loss of the
valuable setter Princess Patricia, by
strychnine poisoning, owned by John
S. Brown, I wish to say that all dog
fanciers should have in their possession
a hypodermic syringe, and a tube
containing amorphine. When the
symptoms of strychnine poisoning are
seen in their canine beauties, such as
spasmodic convulsions, stiffening,
cracking of joints, etc., use one tablet
of amorphine, one-tenth grain dis-
solved in water, sufficient to fill hypo-
dermic, probably 20 m.m. up to 5 c.c.
makes no difference.Take the canine by the back of the
neck (don't be afraid, for a sick ani-
mal will never harm you) and inject
the contents under the skin. Place
the animal in a dark room and leave
