

COMMITTEE URGES G. M. S. DISMISSAL

Ald. Manness Says Coat Is
Worn Out From Being
Slapped On Back.

MAY AFFECT SIR ADAM

Member Says Latimer Doesn't
Want Mr. Gaultz as
Manager Now.

One of the most interesting civic discussions on the Gaultz case that has ever occurred at the city hall took place informally last night between the members of No. 4 committee, when Ald. Manness asked what the committee could do to secure the dismissal of Mr. Gaultz at once, and also to bring the utilities board under the control that the citizens should have.

Controller White was the only one who defended Mr. Gaultz, and he was met with such effective arguments by the members of the committee that he admitted that Mr. Gaultz would have to go.

Takes Strong Stand.
"If Mr. Gaultz had a spark of spirit about him," said Chairman Merrifield, "he would go away from London. He knows that the people don't want him. If I were as poor as a church mouse, and the utilities board had refused me as they did him, I would have thanked them for what they did and resigned immediately. He is after that big salary, and I want to tell you right now that there are thousands of people in London who are satisfied that there are Britons and Canadians right here who are doing the real work that Mr. Gaultz is getting paid for. The men who are doing the work are not getting half of that fat salary he has. There is only one thing to it, and he must go."

People Favor Retirement.
"Since I introduced that notice of motion regarding Gaultz at the council meeting the other night," said Ald. Manness, "I have nearly had a hole worn in the back of my coat by people patting me on the back and congratulating me. Everywhere one goes people want this council to do its duty and get Mr. Gaultz. I would certainly like to have seen Chairman Pocock accept Commissioner Mitchell's challenge and go to the polls on the question."

"Do you think Mitchell would win?" asked Controller White.
"I would bet all the money I could raise that he would swamp Pocock," said Ald. Manness. "Gaultz has already wrecked Commissioners Pocock and Chapman, and he will ruin Sir Adam Beck yet."

Controller White said the commissioners were elected by the people, and ought to know their business.
Should Resign Now.
"Gaultz has got to go," that's all there is to it," said Chairman Merrifield. "Public opinion at this time won't stand for him. He says he is going to resign on May 1. Why doesn't he resign now? Anybody else in his position would."

"Sir Adam Beck is keeping himself in the background in this affair," said Ald. Manness.
"It is reported that Sir Adam and Mr. Gaultz are none too friendly now," said Controller White.
"Sir Adam doesn't want him now for general manager of the Port Stanley line," said Ald. Manness. "Mayor Stevenson will do the proper thing in refusing to sign his pay check."

"One of these days he may be out of town, and it will be signed by the acting mayor," said Controller White.
Won't Sign Checks.
"I am going to be acting mayor any time the mayor is away," said Ald. Manness. "I'll guarantee it won't be signed if I am."
"I would sign it," said Chairman Merrifield. "A good many citizens have wondered why a man drawing such a big salary as Mr. Gaultz does from the city should leave his car standing for hours with the engine running down in front of the club."

The question of the suit against Ald. Manness came up, and the members were of the opinion that Mr. Gaultz was on his feet. They said that Mr. Gaultz has already admitted that the charges made by Ald. Manness against him were correct. Ald. Manness, it was held, was fully prepared to prove everything, and Mr. Gaultz knew it.

"Well, what I want to know is how we can get after this matter," said Ald. Manness. "And also bring the utilities board to time."
"The clerk Baker said that the supervision of the parks and waterworks might be taken away from them."

"All right then, we will take up with the council the matter of taking the departments away from them," said Ald. Manness. "Any way to get at this question. The citizens are going to insist that we do something."

REFUSING IMPORTS
Germany Prohibits Products of Hostile Countries.
LONDON, Feb. 17.—The Bundesrat's authorization to the chancellor to prohibit the importation and transit of the products of hostile countries, and industry across the German frontier is reported in today's edition of the Reichs Anzeiger, says an Amsterdam dispatch to Reuters' Telegrams.

The chancellor is authorized to take any measures necessary to enforce the prohibition.
The ground for this authorization is another proclamation, which prohibits the importation and transit of several products mentioned from France and Great Britain, their colonies and protectorates. The proclamation mentions each of these products.

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COGNAC SHOULDER DEER REY IN AFRICA

Was On His Way To Stir
Up a Rebellion At
Pothestroom.

It has recently come to light that at the time of his death De La Rey was on his way to Pothestroom to incite the defence forces there, consisting of about 1,000 men, to rebellion. His object was to march with that force to Pretoria and seize the main stores belonging to Gen. Botha and divide them among the rebels.

Death Ended Scheme.
He was killed accidentally by a shot fired by the police, who were at the time of the automobile in which he was riding, believing it contained some highway robbers. The police were on their way to raid the war stores, and there seems little doubt now but he and Beyers were paid agents in the employ of the Germans, who were chiefly because of his versatility. Since the beginning of the war, no one has recognized more clearly than Wilhelm II. himself that he was not equal to the task.

Great Man Lacking.
"That he should have stepped into the background, hoping that the great and glorious year," as the Germans were to call 1914, would produce a great man, is perhaps a tribute to his political acumen. Up to the present it would appear that the great man has not been found. This is of deeper concern to many Germans than they are willing to admit. Their one consolation is that, according to their way of thinking, their enemies are in the same straits.

KAISER FOUND LACKING
Wilhelm Realizes That He
Is Not Equal To
The Task.

London, Feb. 18.—A neutral observer, who has just concluded a tour of Germany and Austria, writing in the London Times regarding Germany's need of a strong man in the present crisis, says: "The whole of Germany's system has been built up with the idea of a strong man at the helm, a virtual dictator of public affairs, and, still more important, of public opinion—a Bismarck. In times of peace the present Emperor played his part admirably, chiefly because of his versatility. Since the beginning of the war, no one has recognized more clearly than Wilhelm II. himself that he was not equal to the task."

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
