

WINDSOR POLICE CHIEF
WANTS FIVE MORE MEN

Increased Staff Will Mean Adding \$12,000 To Estimates Already \$131,700.

WINDSOR, March 2.—Estimates of the police department were finally passed this afternoon by the police commission. They will now go to the finance committee of the city council for consideration and approval.

Proposed expenditures total \$131,700, approximately \$2,000 more than last year. Chief Thompson also favors the addition of five men to the department, which will mean adding on about \$12,000 to the estimates. The

chief was delegated to attend the meeting of the finance committee to explain the need for more men. At a recent meeting of the commission a delegation from the south-east section of the city asked for increased police protection. This request will be cited by the chief before the committee.

THREE WOMEN PERISH IN FIRE. Waupun, Wis., March 2.—Three women, employees of the C. H. Shaller Vulcanizing Company, perished here last night, when the entire plant was destroyed by fire. The loss is estimated at more than \$500,000.

SEIZES COMPLETE STILL

St. Thomas Police Also Nab Thomas Holland.

ST. THOMAS, March 2.—A fully-equipped still, including worm, condenser and boiler, was seized by Detective McCulley and other members of the local police force at the home of Thomas Holland Thursday afternoon.

Holland lives in a small house on vacant land east of the Pere Marquette shops. The still, along with barrels and bottles containing mash and some mysterious liquid resembling rum, was seized in a number of small buildings which dot Holland's property.

The case will be heard Friday morning.

FURTHER PLANS
FOR ELGIN FAIR

Representatives of Various Breeders' Associations Meet in St. Thomas.

COMMITTEES FORMED

All City and County Organizations Invited to Co-operate in Project.

ST. THOMAS, March 2.—The first definite step towards the organization of a winter fair in this city to serve Elgin County was taken Thursday afternoon when representatives from several agricultural, poultry and cattle breeders associations discussed the matter fully at a meeting held for the purpose in the city hall.

Without exception the delegates present favored the idea and everyone believed that such an undertaking would prove highly successful. Each representative pledged the support of his organization, and now steps will be taken to gain the co-operation of various other clubs and the sympathy of the citizens of both the county and city.

The matter will be taken up further by a special committee composed of the president, the secretary and one other member of all the organizations represented at the meeting, which included the Ayrshire, Shorthorn and Holstein Breeders' Associations, the Poultry Association, and the Children's Calf and Pet Stock Club.

Will Meet March 11. The committee will hold its first meeting Saturday afternoon, March 11. Representatives from the city council, the chamber of commerce, the county board of trade, county council, and the Kiwanis Club will be invited to attend and to co-operate with the committee.

HOGS SUFFER SET-BACK

Drop One Dollar On St. Thomas Market.

ST. THOMAS, March 2.—Live hog prices suffered a slump Thursday, dropping from the week-opening price of \$13.50 per cwt to \$12.50, according to quotations received from St. Thomas Packing Company, Limited. Buyers predicted last week that the top prices had been reached and that declines were in sight. The market is considerably weaker.

The egg market is also unsteady, with wholesale quotation Thursday of 28 cents a dozen, as against 30 to 32 cents at the commencement of the week.

Butter, wholesale, ranges around 35 cents for creamery prints.

Empire Flour Mills, Limited, is still paying \$1.35 per bushel for Ontario winter wheat.

Middlings were quoted at \$33 to \$35 a ton.

NEW TYPE OF FLU
ATTACKS POLAND

Warsaw, March 2.—A new kind of influenza, with a complication of jaundice, has made its appearance in Poland. The disease is particularly virulent along the eastern borders, where refugees are pouring in by thousands daily from Russia. The mortality rate is high.

CATTLE ARRIVE AT GLASGOW. London, March 2.—(Canadian Press Cable.)—A shipment of 340 head of Canadian cattle arrived at Glasgow on the Lakonia. The cattle were of prime quality, and there was an improved demand for them. Steers sold at from 12 to 14 cents per pound, and bulls at from 8 to 10 cents.
