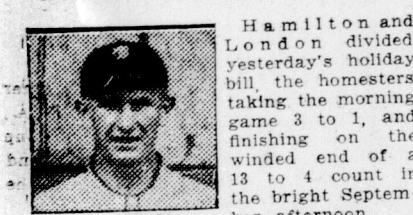


Delman Allows Hams But 3 Hits In Morning, But Tecs Are Routed In Afternoon

Two Holiday Games Show Ham Series Will Be Tight

Seventeen Hits Collected by Clipper Sluggers in Afternoon Contest.

Hamilton and London divided yesterday's holiday bill, the home team taking the morning game 2 to 1, and finishing on the winched end of a 13 to 4 count in the night session after afternoon.

The morning game was a ball game. The afternoon affair was a rout. Joe Delman in the first named affair allowed but three hits. Two of these, triple by Froman and a single by Gleich, sandwiched two outs in the first inning and produced the Clippers' lone tally.

Nettles' double was the only blow that made any impression against the heavy ball Delman was heaving up at the ham batters, and it rang out in the fifth, which inning marked the only time more than three men faced the London hurler. Otherwise the only pattering the little feet of the Hams did was back to the dugout and out to the field.

The game was won in the first inning. The Hams started it, and the Tecs ended it in their half, when four singles and an error showed three runs, and Lefty McCallum, Baker scoring on the hit, and Beatty counting on the misplay. Nason counted on Coogan's single down past short. Lefty McCallum settled down thereafter, and while touched up for five more hits, he kept them well scattered.

Big Karl Adams weathered a four-hit onslaught which produced three runs in the first inning of the afternoon game, and then held the Indians to four scattered hits and one run for the rest of the piece, while the Ham sluggers' retaliation fell on Achenbach and Fields for a grand total of 17 hits, which with two errors were good for 13 tallies.

A Good Start. Singles by Sandquist and Baker, Beatty's sacrifice and Nason's triple off the left field fence, scored two runs, and Coogan scored Nason with a single in the first frame. This was practically like the morning game, but from then on there was no similarity. With two gone in the second inning, Schwab dropped Achenbach's throw and suffered a split finger. Robertson bounced a high grounder which Achenbach hit in the sun. Adams and Froman were hit by successive wild shots, unloading a run each time, and keeping the bases filled. Roper, who got for his eighth trip, scored and drove in five, got the first of his afternoon's ration of blows, a double, cleaning the bases. Achenbach settled down and struck out McGee, who was still in the line, and looked straightened away, but Robertson's single and Froman's double were tallied in by Roper's single in the fourth, and McGee's single made him take the full count. Gleich filed the bases with a bounce over Field's head. Nettles' sacrifice fly scored Roper, but Schwab popped out to end it temporarily.

Still More. A walk to Robertson and Froman's single set the stage for more counting in the fifth. Roper's single to right scored Froman, and as Coogan made a needless and wild throw to third, Froman tallied.

Sandquist's triple, which scored as Beatty's grounded out, was London's squeaky-voued protest to the assault and battery in the fifth. Baker's triple had gone to waste in the third, Gleich's single in the run and Schwab's double ferried two more runs across to end the scoring.
