When the sentence of death was imposed on Sidney Murrell, Henry Jack "Slim" Williams and Clarence Topping this morning they were the 10th, 11th and 12th persons respectively convicted of a capital crime in the county of Middlesex.

Never before in the history of this province, so far as is known, have three men, one of whom had no co nection with crimes committed the other two, been sentenced to gallows all together within the shor space of a few minutes.




