

Hon. James Dunsmuir Transfers Coal Holdings to Mr. William Mackenzie



THE LATE ROBERT DUNSMUIR

During last week the entire coal holdings of the late Robert Dunsmuir upon Vancouver Island passed into the possession of William Mackenzie, the president of the Canadian Northern Railway and member of the firm of Mackenzie & Mann, the great railway builders of Canada.

It was a remarkable transaction, more ways than one. The sum of money involved amounted to some five million dollars; the deal is yet another earnest of the great captain of industry's interest in British Columbia and Vancouver Island in particular, and marks the retirement from coal mining of the Dunsmuir family after a period of nearly sixty years in which they have dominated the industry.

WILLIAM MACKENZIE

Since the death of my brother I have been in charge of the entire interest in the Comox and Esquimalt mines.

THE HON. JAMES DUNSMUIR

My first action was to buy out the four San Francisco shareholders who had a half interest in the Comox mines. I paid them \$1,500,000 for their share.

WILL QUADRUPE OUTPUT

Extensions and improvements costing \$2,000,000 and \$4,000,000 will be made in the present capacity and when complete give employment to 5,000 additional men.
