TURKEY AND THE POWERS THE PORT ACCEPTS THE INVITATION OF THE CONFERENCE.

Nothing Doing at Alexandria - Arab's Position Strong - His Meeting at Cairo - England Still Preparing for the Worst. CONSTANTINOPLE, July 20 - The text of the port's reply to the identical note of the powers states that if the port has not hitherto decided on its own initiative to send troops to Egypt, it is because it was convinced that vigorous measures were avoidable.

Complete Arrangements for Success - The Order and Route of Procession - The Orators - Prospects of an Immense Turn-out. The committee of arrangements of the Trades union demonstration at Exhibition grounds to-morrow have concluded their labor, and everything has been done to ensure success.

Reduced fares have been granted on all the railways, and many workmen from adjacent cities and towns are expected to arrive in order to prevent any jealousy regarding who should take precedence in the procession.

Grand Marshal - Mounted on a Carriage, containing Messrs. McGuire of New York, Power of Chicago, and Armstrong, President of Toronto Trades and Labor Council.

All the trades will carry emblems of their respective industries, and several will have them on a large scale. The orators of the day will be Mr. McGuire of New York, grand secretary of the American brotherhood of carpenters and joiners; Mr. Power of the Chicago seaman's union; and the following local gentlemen: Messrs. Armstrong, president of the trades and labor council; Moor and Rose, of the amalgamated society of carpenters; Oakley, stenographer union; Lewis, seaman's union; O'Donoghue, printers' union; Juby, tailors' union; Marsh and Cleary, painters' union; Hethorn, harness-makers' union; and J. B. Myers, brewers union.

The proceedings commence at the Queen's park at 10 o'clock, when at first sight all the different trades form around their banners; second call, fall into line; third call, start in procession in their allotted places.

The route of the procession will be as follows: Meet in the Queen's park; thence along Greenway to Yonge street; down Yonge to King street; along King to Simcoe street; up Simcoe to Queen street; along Queen to Strachan avenue; down Strachan avenue to Exhibition grounds.
