ANOTHER PENNY INCOME TAX

THE BRITISH BUDGET SHOWS A SLIGHT DEFICIT.

To Meet This Sir William Verdon Harcourt Proposes to Increase the Income Tax a Penny a Pound. The Idea Generally Favorably Commented Upon in the House.

LONDON, April 24.—In the House of Commons today Sir William Verdon Harcourt, Conservative member for the City of London, proposed an amendment to the Irish Home Rule Bill that the Government should withdraw the military forces from Ireland and use the proceeds of the tax to be levied on the Home Rule area. He also made motions intended to debate the Irish Government from having the demands of the British army in maintaining the authority of the Home Rule Parliament.

The Budget Speech.

Sir William Verdon Harcourt, Chancellor of the Exchequer, introduced the budget for the coming financial year in the House of Commons today.

The Chancellor estimated the expenditure for the current financial year at £291,464,000 and the revenue at £289,850,000, leaving a deficit of £1,614,000. He stated that the Government expected a decrease of the revenue, but chiefly to the vast growth of expenditures not created by the Government, but through the demands of the country upon Parliament.

Another Penny in the Pound.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer would not propose to cover the deficit by increasing the sinking fund devoted to the reduction of the national debt. He preferred to meet the deficit by the straightforward way of increased taxation. He had, therefore, resorted to a slight increase in the penny in the pound, which would amount to £1,750,000 to the revenue.

The Right Hon. G. G. Coochey, who is Chancellor of the Exchequer under Lord Salisbury's administration, said that he would refrain from criticizing the budget, but he concluded with the Chancellor of the Exchequer in having to meet rising expenditures with a falling revenue.

Favorable Comments.

The Right Hon. Sir J. Lubbock, Liberal Unionist, said that he approved meeting the deficit by direct taxation, but that other comments were made, generally favorable to the budget.

A Frigate's Squander.

Colonel Howard Vincent, referring to a dubious cable dispatch to the effect that President Cleveland proposed to appropriate the money for the purchase of a frigate for the United States with certain foreign countries, asked Sir Edward Grey, Parliamentary Secretary for Foreign Affairs, whether that information was for the report. Sir Edward Grey replied that he had no information on the subject, but that he would look into the matter.

Instituted Intemperate Speeches.

As regards all the intemperate speeches made by Mr. Sexton had designated Mr. Balfour and Lord Randolph Churchill, Mr. Asquith expressed his heavy responsibility by using intemperate language directly calculated to incite the members of the Government to take any step, he said, to prevent a recurrence of the deplorable demonstrations in Belfast, and believed further trouble would be averted.
