The Woman Vote.

The law of the land is that unmarried women and widows who own property should have a say in municipal affairs. The principle recognized was that all property should have a voice in its taxation by the municipality and that women should be enfranchised as a class.

We are informed that a great deal of property is now owned in the name of wives and daughters who may be expected to vote regularly in all municipal elections.

It is also a fact that in some Christian Temperance Union and other kindred associations are promoting a movement to have property put in the names of wives and daughters who may be expected to vote.

Editor World: It is not true that the citizens of Toronto took some action toward saving the remainder of their property! Such has been the mismanagement of our municipal authorities that the yearly returns from Toronto houses and lands are divided until many proprietors are receiving very little indeed on their investments.

There is nothing to say against women voting, but it believes that it ought to be regulated as the votes of men, and that the public should be made aware of tactics which are filling the lists with the names of women voters.

And the public ought to know that a considerable portion of the women of this city have deliberately gone into municipal politics and that others who follow will.
