Cheese Factories—We are informed that a cheese factory is to be established in Newburg. Camden, large enough to use the milk of 400 cows, and that a person has gone to the States on behalf of the company to find out the best plan for the construction of the same. A company is also being formed to establish another, for at least the same number of cows, at Waterloo, near this city. Experience proves that cheese factories are the most economical manufactories of cheese, and we are glad, forther than this, to see that farmers are becoming alive to the fact that the removal of every grown crop from their lands is not the way to kern them in the rich and most productive state. Two cheese factories have been in successful operation in Ernestown the past season, and we are informed that 20 per cent, has been declared upon the stock invested. The poorest cows have more than paid for themselves in the one season.—Western paper.

OTTAWA PASSENOER RAILWAY COMPANY.—It is stated that stock to the amount of \$20,000 has been taken in the City Passenger Railway in that city; and but \$10,000 more is necessary, when the work will be proceeded with.
