PREPARING FOR THE RUSH--TWO SPLENDID STEAMERS ORDERED.

Although there are at present steamers making regular tri-weekly trips between Victoria and Sound points, these are not deemed sufficient to meet the requirements of the great passenger trade of the immediate future. Accordingly the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company, owners of the present line of steamers, have just let contracts for two steel, sidewheel, walking beam steamboats for service on this route. They will be alike in every respect, 260 feet long, 48 feet beam, and will draw 12 feet. Each will have stateroom accommodations for 300 passengers, and for 1500 day passengers, and the pair will cost \$250,000. They will come round the Horn under sail and steam, and the contract requires that they be delivered in Puget Sound waters by December 15th of this year. It is needless to add that they will be the finest and the swiftest boats in the Pacific waters. They have been ordered to meet the constantly growing travel northward, and will be used exclusively for passengers.
